



### JUBILLE 2025 – PILGRIMS OF HOPE THE GOOD SAMARITAN



This Sunday's Gospel story of the Good Samaritan is well known. Even secular media, speakers, and the like use this term describing someone who jumps into action to help an unknown person in need. As we reflect on this story, it's good to remember why Jesus tells it.

A scholar of the Law tests Jesus with the intent of trapping Him in His response. Jesus' response of loving God with one's whole heart, mind, soul and strength is fine for the scholar. It's Jesus' further addition of- "You shall love your neighbor as yourself"- from the Book of Leviticus that leads the man to ask further, "Who is my neighbor?" In response, Jesus tells the Good Samaritan story.

How it begins is foreboding. A man travels alone from the heights of Jerusalem down towards the city of Jericho. A very dangerous road to be on alone. There robbers fall upon him, taking all he has, and beating him within an inch of his life, leaving him for dead. He is most likely beaten so badly no one could even recognize who he was or where he came from.

Help may be on its way when a priest and then a Levite come upon him. But no, they pass by.

Now comes along a Samaritan, someone hated by Jews. He looks upon the man, not questioning if he is a Jew, a Samaritan or a Gentile. All he sees is a man in dire and desperate need and he tends to his wounds. After, he takes him to an innkeeper, leaving him money for his care, with the promise to return. Story complete, Jesus asks the scholar who was neighbor to the man. His reply- "The one who showed him mercy."

Who is the Good Samaritan? Jesus. Who is the man beaten and left for dead? You and I. St. Paul will say, "But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus" (Eph 2:4-6).

God, seeing humanity mortally wounded by sin and unable to heal ourselves, jumps into action and shows us mercy by sending Jesus to heal us and raise us up with Him, as St. Paul makes clear. Jesus does so by His own passion, death and resurrection. In so doing He unites us to Himself, and in turn, we become united to one another.

This means that we are our brother and sister's keeper. To be a Christian means that we cannot simply say, "That's not my problem" in the face of suffering. Becoming like Jesus, we must act with compassion and mercy at the suffering of others, not questioning whether they deserve our help or not. The Pilgrims of Hope logo reminds us of our unity with others and to

Jesus.


