You probably have heard of all four in your own spiritual reading, and quite probably have experienced these in

JUBILLE 2025 – PILGRIMS OF HOPE ORDINARY TIME ISN'T ORDINARY AT ALL

Even though we have been in "Ordinary Time" since the Solemnity of Pentecost, it may not have seemed that way. First we celebrated the two Solemnities of the Holy Trinity and then Corpus Christi which always follow Pentecost. Then last Sunday we had an extra bonus feast that I find inspiring- the Solemnity of SS. Peter and Paul. With these now behind us, we will be



entering more fully into Ordinary Time. But there can be a lot of confusion about this sacred season. For example, I remember early in Pope Benedict XVI's pontificate, a reporter made the comment that the Pope was wearing green vestments because he was concerned about the ecology. He was, this reporter said, the first "green Pope." I chuckled to myself, knowing that this journalist obviously knew little about Catholic worship.

As you know, each liturgical season has its own color- Advent and Lent being purple, white during Christmas and Easter, and red on Passion Sunday, Good Friday and Pentecost, as well as the feast days of martyrs. Outside of these seasons, we have what is known as Ordinary Time, the longest season of our Church year. Its liturgical color is green. The priest's vestments, the chalice veil and the banners are signals to us that we have entered Ordinary Time. That said, Ordinary Time does not mean that this season is ho-hum, or that it is not extra-ordinary. Rather, Ordinary Time comes from the word "ordinal" which means "counted" time. You'll notice in the bulletin, on the parish calendars, and in the hymnal section of the readings which Sunday in Ordinary Time it is. Today, July 6 is the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 13th will be the 15th Sunday and so on until November when we reach the last Sunday of the Church Year, the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time, which is known as the Solemnity of Christ the King. It is on that day that we look back in a sense, reflecting upon the entire Church year being mindful of all that Jesus Christ has done, and in so doing, we joyfully hail Him as our King, as Lord of our lives. About 100 years ago in Mexico, when the Church and religion were being suppressed by the government, "Viva Christo Rey" ("Long Live Christ the King") was on the lips of thousands of faithful men, women and even children.

Ordinary Time does not mean that it is not extra-ordinary. In fact it is just the opposite- Ordinary Time is very extraordinary! Everything, including time, is graced by God and is pure gift. The very fact that we exist, and awoke this morning, is a gift from God. The reality that God loves us so much that He is present to us at each moment, and that He comes to us in Word, Sacrament and in the events of daily life is, I believe, quite extraordinary! Unlike some religions that believe that God is distant and unconcerned about human affairs, Catholic belief is just the opposite. God is present everywhere all the time, and is always mindful of us, our concerns and our needs. As St. Paul said to the people of Athens, it is through God "that we live, move and have our being" (Acts 17:28). Each and every Sunday we gather as one people to praise God for all that He has done, is doing and will do for us individually, and for the life of the world through Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. Our worship during Ordinary Time, as we hear the Word of God proclaimed and are nourished with Jesus' very Body in the Eucharist, is meant to change us more into the persons God created us to be. We are to be transformed more and more into the likeness of His Son. This saying is a good reminder, "Time is a gift, that is why it is called the present." Enjoy the gift of Ordinary Time- unwrap and treasure God's most precious gift to us- Jesusand share with others the gifts the Lord has given you.


