#### THE SOLEMNITY OF THE **ASSUMPTION OF MARY, AUGUST 15**

On Friday, August 15, the Church joyfully celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states in paragraph 966,

"Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of Lords and the conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians."

The Assumption of Mary is God's gift for her lifelong fiat, her continual saying yes to God's will for her life. Being kept free from original sin by God's grace from the moment of her conception, and by His grace assisting her to be free from sin throughout her life, Mary's being taken body and soul into heaven is a continuation and completion of God's marvelous grace working in and through her. As the Catechism says, it is also an anticipation of our own resurrection on the last day when our body and soul will be reunited again. What the Blessed Mother already experiences in joy, we will also experience one day by God's mercy and grace.

The Assumption of Mary is one of our holy days of obligation and opportunity. It is a wonderful occasion for us to give thanks to God for all He has done through the cooperation and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

#### JUBILLE 2025 – PILGRIMS OF HOPE LOOKING FORWARD IN HOPE

Last week my wife and I were on vacation in Minnesota. For Mass, we went to Queen of Peace Church in Cloquet, MN, a city of about 12,000 residents. In his homily, the priest focused on three areas for the parishioners to consider. I'll share the basics of what he said, and my own thoughts.

His first point was the Mass- the Eucharist. He noted that Sunday worship was the highlight of the week for Catholics. It is at the Eucharistic table that God's people are nourished and feed for the week ahead. At Mass, the bread and wine become the True Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus. The Eucharist unites us to Him, and to one another. It is here too, that we bring our own intentions, and lay them on the altar for the Lord to take them up and transform them. As he highlighted the importance of Mass, he also noted that so many people who are registered members of Queen of Peace, do not participate in the weekly celebration. By not doing so, the Body of Christ in Cloquet is less than it could be. Their absence is felt, just as it would be if 2/3 of one's family chose not to come home for Christmas, even if they only lived a few miles away. His challenge to those gathered was to "go out into the city" and invite family, friends and co-workers back to Mass.

His second point was short. Just one sentence. Well-formed parishioners should get involved in politics. The Church is very clear of the importance of people participating in civic life. By studying our faith, and immersing ourselves in Catholic social teaching, Catholics bring a wealth of knowledge and a faith-informed perspective to politics, government and civic life at every level. Our faith in Jesus Christ, crucified and risen from the dead, is to inform our politics and decisions, and not the other way around. In this way we become leaven for the world.

His final point began by noting that many of their parishioners do not reside within the city limits. He asked for a show of hands of who lived in Cloquet. I was shocked. I think only about 10% of the people raised their hands. His vision was that Queen of Peace become, in my words, "a city set on a hill." He envisioned the parish campus- church and school- becoming a central place for everyone in the parish to gather for Mass and other events. He hoped one day that the parking lot would be the site of a convent, which in turn would house sisters to serve in their school. He noted needed upgrades to their physical plant that would better serve the needs of the parish family and community. He had high hopes for the people of Queen of Peace and the people of Cloquet. To the changes of their physical campus, I would add that people changed, transformed and empowered by the Gospel are beacons of hope to others. People on fire for their faith, in their intense love for God and for others, are attractive. (Just as the mosquitos were to me!)

Reclaiming Sunday, getting involved in the life of the community, and internal and external transformation are central to our Christian mission of hope. ~Bill Manthe
