GRIEF SHARE AT ST. CLEMENT

Grief after the death of a loved one can be overwhelming. One can experience a host of feelings, thoughts, behaviors and physical reactions that can make one question one's own mental wellbeing. There is the notion that, "time heals all wounds." Time can bring healing, but it's often what we do during this time that brings about relief and renewed hope. It has also been said that, "grief shared is grief diminished." Those who have been involved in the GriefShare bereavement support group can attest to this. Through video, discussion and sharing, GriefShare is a 13-session process that brings people together who have experienced loss and who seek support and healing in their unique journey.

Our GriefShare support group had its first session last week, but you are still welcome to join us. We gather on Thursdays from 6-8 PM at St. Clement Church in the parish office meeting room. MENTAL HEALTH RETREAT & NEWS

JUBILEE 2025 – PILGRIMS OF HOPE AND OUR BLESSED MOTHER

Friday was the Feast of the Queenship of Mary. A week earlier, Pope Leo XIV gave a special Angelus address

August 15 for the Solemnity of the Assumption, encouraging the faithful to look up to the Blessed Mother, she who "shines as an icon of hope," while traveling along the uncertain and difficult roads of life.

"The Mother of Jesus in the glory which she possesses in body and soul in heaven is the image and beginning of the church as it is to be perfected in the world to come," he quoted. "Likewise, she shines forth on earth, until the day of the Lord shall come, a sign of certain hope and comfort to the pilgrim people of God."

Continuing, Pope Leo emphasized that the Blessed Mother has had a special role for centuries.

"Mary, who the risen Christ carried body and soul into the glory, shines as an icon of hope for her pilgrim children throughout history," he said.

Verses from the great poet Dante's Paradiso come to mind, he added, as the last canto describes Our Lady as "the living fountain-head of hope," meaning, "the living spring, gushing with hope."

This reflection is especially timely in 2025, as the Catholic Church is celebrating the Jubilee Year of Hope with the theme, "Pilgrims of hope," he noted.

"Pilgrims need a goal that orients their journey: a beautiful and attractive goal that guides their steps and revives them when they are tired, that always rekindles in their heart a desire and hope," he said. "On the path of life, our goal is God, infinite and eternal Love, fullness of life, peace, joy and every good thing. The human heart is drawn to such beauty and it is not happy until it finds it; and indeed it risks not finding it if it gets lost in the middle of the 'dark forest' of evil and sin."

The Pontiff also reflected that it is a grace that "God came to meet us" by assuming human nature, and then Christ returned to Heaven as both God and man.

"It is the mystery of Jesus Christ, who became flesh, died and rose for our salvation. Inseparable from him, is also the mystery of Mary, the woman from whom the Son of God has taken flesh, and of the Church, the mystical body of Christ," he said. "It concerns a unique mystery of love, and thus of freedom."

He explained that Mary said "yes," believing in the Lord's word, just as Jesus said "yes."

"All of her life has been a pilgrimage of hope together with her son, the Son of God, a pilgrimage which, through the Cross and Resurrection, has reached the heavenly homeland, in the embrace of God," he concluded. "For this reason, while we journey forward, as individuals, families and communities, especially when the clouds come and the road seems difficult and uncertain, let us lift our gaze, let us look at her, our Mother, and we will rediscover the hope that does not disappoint."

Adult Faith Formation at St. Clement

We continue this week with Fr. Dave Pivonka's study on the Holy Spirit, titled "THE WILD GOOSE: Discovering a Deeper Relationship with The Holy Spirit." This week we will be looking at two sessions. One is titled, "The Spirit and the Eucharist" and the other is "The Spirit Gives Witness." In the Eucharist, Jesus is fully and truly present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. If you listen closely to the words of the priest just prior to the words of institution, he says, addressing the Father, "Let your Spirit come upon these gifts that they may become the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ." It is the Holy Spirit that effects change. Change in ordinary bread and wine, and change in us. We are to be so changed that we go forth and tell others what the Lord has done for us.

We meet on Tuesday mornings after the 8:15 AM Mass in the parish office meeting room. Please note: If Mass is cancelled, we will still meet at 9 AM. All are welcome to join us for this engaging study!
