





When you look around our church at Mass, at all the many faces, ages, and stages of life, do you ever think: "Wow, look at all of these Saints Under Construction!"? If you haven't thought about it, give it a try because every one of us is a saint in the making; we are all sinners working toward heaven one day – or minute – at a time.

Take Donna Jardine, for instance. She was baptized Cahtolic as a baby and made her First Communion, but her construction project is only just starting. "When my parents split up when I wasyoung, we didn't go to church anymore." Fast forward a few decades to 2020 or so, when Donna met Mary, Queen of Peace parishioner Elliot LeNormand at

work. "I knew he was Catholic, so I kept asking him a lot of questions," she said. "He kept trying to get me to go to RCIA (now OCI – the Order of Christian Initiation). I was like, no, I don't want to study. I don't want to read a book. I don't want to do homework. He kept telling me I wouldn't have to study, so after about two years of him bugging me, I joined RCIA."

Donna was confirmed in the Catholic faith at the Easter Vigil in 2023 with Elliot as her sponsor, and now Mary, Queen of Peace Parish is her home. "Elliot said he's noticed a change in me," she said, for the good. "I think I'm a nicer person." She's also an involved person, helping at parish receptions and other events as part of the Catholic Daughters. "They came into one of our last RCIA classes and they told us about the group. I thought: That's what I want, to volunteer."

"I usually volunteer whenever I see something that I can do," Donna said, including her help with the Magic Yarn Project this Lent, a project that helps create wigs for children with cancer. In fact, she took on a challenge while wrapping yarn at a recent fish fry: "I took the hardest one, and then I said, you have any more? They had a problem one (meaning the yarn was tangled mess), so I volunteered for that. It took two of us to untangle the yarn."

When it comes to untangling yarn – or our lives – two is always better than one. When you look around the church at Mass, be sure to pray for all the saints under construction. And if you see Donna, most likely in a pew at 11:30, thank her for making the journey at MQP.


JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE


these next 12 months so that each may truly have an encounter with Christ Jesus that leads to a renewal of hope. Scan the code to learn more about Jubilee 2025.


