



Council Report:

The November meeting was held in the School Cafeteria on Tuesday November 18th. We Prayed the Rosary, had a meal, which was prepared by Brother Wiley's cooking team. This month brother John Cook put together a Mac & Chili dish. Again they did a wonderful job. We then followed up with the Council meeting.

Report of Clergy

Fr. Cooper talked about the status of our parish, our growth, and our activities. .

- We are coming to the week of Thanksgiving and we must be thankful for all that we have. We must be grateful to God and we have a responsibility to help those in need.
- We just had our annual Fleur de Fall, which was very successful, but we must look to grow it into an even larger event for the coming years.
- We are continuing to get new parishioners. To show the growth of our Catholic community we had 20 people baptized. This does not include those who are going through reformation. In contrast in his recent pilgrimage to Europe, those churches had much fewer people than what we have. They are simply empty, and those attending are usually over 60 years of age. And to show an example of how well our parish is doing we have one family who comes from Tickfaw to attend Mass every Sunday.
- We are entering the "I Give Catholic" campaign and the funds are to pour back into the people not the infrastructure. We are doing a lot for our children and young families. We are doing things such as training and a relatively new program, MQP CARES which visits those of child birth, illnesses, hospitalizations or bereavement.
- ACTS – The new men's retreat is accepting reservations. Scheduled for January 8-11, 2026 at the Solomon Retreat Center. See Church Bulletin for more information. It can accommodate 40 men. Fr Cooper is expecting every man in the Knights to eventually attend one of the ACTS sessions.
- A New program to start is ALPHA, It's a safe place to question life, faith & meaning. Everyone is Welcome. It will be on Tuesday Nights, January – April. See bulletting for more information.
- And coming up it will be a busy December for what he asks of the Knights, beginning with Christ in Chaos on December 1st and making beignets at Hospitality Sunday on December 7th.

Gumbo Cook-off:



THE PROCESS

- If you are selected as the Council winner, your local Knights of Columbus Council will notify you.
- Councils submit their winners to the State by **February 7, 2026**.



STEP 3 - WIN STATE LEVEL

- The State Council **reviews/scores all applications** from the local Council winners.
- The **top 5 male** and **top 5 female** applicants are selected to attend **CYLA State Finals**.
- State CYLA Chairman, Delmas Forbes, **will email the top 5 in each division**.
- Sponsoring Councils of the top 5 in each division are also contacted.

STEP 4 - ATTEND STATE CYLA FINALS

- The **top 5 male** and **top 5 female applicants** selected from the Council winners are invited to attend CYLA State Finals in Baton Rouge.
- Everyone invited will win a cash prize between \$1,000 and \$5,000!**

October is the Month of the Rosary

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on Oct. 7. It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The Rosary is appealing and simple. The purpose of the Rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation:


- Every time we pray the Our Father we are reminded that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation.
- Praying the Hail Mary reminds us that we are joining with Mary in contemplating these mysteries.
- In addition, they help to make us aware that Mary was and is still intimately joined with her son, Jesus, in all the mysteries of earthly and heavenly existence. The constant repetition of prayer creates an atmosphere of contemplation.

The traditional 15 Mysteries of the Rosary were finalized by the 16th century. The mysteries are grouped into sets: the Joyful Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries and the Glorious Mysteries.

In 2002, Pope John Paul II announced the new Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary. They fill a gap in the "traditional" mysteries of the Rosary by focusing on Christ's public ministry and serving as a "mystery of light" where Jesus reveals God's glory and message to the world.

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.

5. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading or reflection from Scripture) then pray the Our Father on the large beads.



4. Say one Hail Mary on each of the next three beads asking for an increase in the virtues of faith, hope, and charity. Then, pray a Glory Be.

3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.

6. While holding each of the 10 beads of the decade, say 10 Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery.

7. When you reach the large bead, pray a Glory Be and the Fatima Prayer.

8. After praying all five decades, pray the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:

V: Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
R: That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
