Dominic Deliberations

 ${\bf B}^{\rm eing}$ and Remaining present is a theme that stands out in this Sunday's readings. Abraham was aware of God's messengers, showing them hospitality and Mary was present to Jesus while Martha was worried about many things. In a world where we are with or have access to a lot of pe

ople and yet we are less present with ourselves, with others, and with the Lord; how do we become more present?

"I know of a young man whose loneliness was cured by a priest's simple reminder during a Sunday homily: 'With Jesus always <u>present</u> in the tabernacle, we never have a reason to feel lonely.' Sometimes we need to be reminded of the obvious, and perhaps it takes a particularly difficult moment for a familiar truth to hit home: Jesus is 'here on earth for you' (The Way, no. 539)."

The Lord does not remain with us in the Eucharist for His own sake, but to meet our deepest human needs for love and friendship: "Jesus, who has encouraged this feeling of emptiness in us, comes out to meet us" (*Christ is Passing By*, no. 170). In some, like that young man, the Lord allows a certain loneliness so that they will seek Him out and discover the truth of another equally simple reminder: "When you approach the Tabernacle remember that he has been awaiting you for twenty centuries" (*The Way*, no. 537).

A relationship of permanent <u>remaining or abiding</u> with us is what Jesus ardently desires, and He is most forthright about it in connection with the Eucharist: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him"; "Abide in me, and I in you" (see Jn 6:56; 15:4). The Lord describes the special kind of relationship that He wants to have with us as a <u>mutual abiding</u>. Almost inexplicably, as St Josemaria says, Christ does not want to be parted from us even for an instant.

This 'incomprehensible' fact demands reflection: Hasn't Jesus Christ been an eyewitness to our entire lives, seeing right through us at every moment? Hasn't He seen us at our worst? He has, and in spite of (or because of) our occasional or frequent stupidity, our vanity, selfishness, blindness to what is truly important, Jesus still wants this. He still wants to dwell within us; He still wants *holy communion* with us.

First, make an effort to be with Jesus in the tabernacle by making a visit to church during the day or by attending Eucharistic Adoration.

Second, spend 15 minutes per day in silence sitting with Jesus, listening to Him, speaking to Him, gazing at Him.

Third, every human person is made in the image and likeness of God, so practice being present to others and we will become better at being present to the Lord.

Catholic Corner

July 22: Saint Mary Magdalene—Feast

Saint Mary Magdalene, also known as Magdalene or Mary of Magdala, is likely named for the busy fishing village of Magdala on the Sea of Galilee's western edge. All we know about Mary comes from the Gospels. <u>Luke 8:1–3</u> introduces her as one of the women who accompanied and provided for Jesus and the Twelve. The women had been "cured of evil spirits and infirmities."

The second time that Mary Magdalene is explicitly mentioned in the Bible is at Jesus' crucifixion. Matthew, Mark, and Luke state that she and other women looked on from a distance. John's Gospel has her standing near the Cross next to Jesus' mother and aunt: "Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala" (John 19:25).

Mary Magdalene appears a third time after the Resurrection. Matthew, Mark, and Luke state that she and one or more other women went to the tomb early on Sunday morning to anoint Jesus' body. John's Gospel states that she went alone, found the stone rolled away, and Jesus' body missing. She ran to tell Peter and John, who left after investigating and finding the tomb empty. As Mary sat by the tomb crying, two angels appeared and conversed with her. She then turned and saw someone whom she mistook for the gardener. Asking if he had taken Jesus' body, she recognized Jesus when He said, "Mary!" Jesus said, "Stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, 'I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God'" (John 20:17). Mary quickly informed the disciples that she had seen the Lord.

Because Mary announced Jesus' Resurrection to the disciples, Saint Thomas Aquinas referred to her as the "Apostle to the Apostles." Though the Bible infers that Mary Magdalene was the first to see the risen Lord, some theologians hold that Jesus appeared first to His own Mother, although this is not recorded in the Gospels. Nothing else is known about Mary Magdalene. One tradition says that she accompanied John and the Blessed Mother to Ephesus, where she spent the rest of her days.

Saint Mary Magdalene, when you encountered Jesus, you repented of your sinful life and followed Him. You remained faithful to Him, witnessing His death and Resurrection. Please pray that I may courageously repent of my sins and stand with you at the foot of the Cross so that I may witness the transforming effects of the Resurrection. Saint Mary Magdalene, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.


