Moses recounts great events of salvation history which find their fulfillment in Jesus Christ. We confess him to be Lord, for God raised him from the dead. He is ever faithful, resisting temptation to forsake his Father's mission, trusting in God's love.

#### The Art Of Liturgy

Music and the Mass form a beautiful piece of art known as the Liturgy. When all aspects of the Liturgy are in sync, the art is there and we are transported to a very wonderful, spiritual place. If one of these aspects fails to produce good art, it can be a very disjointed and even, dare I say, disturbing, experience. However, when you have an art that only exists in time, this is something that can easily occur. There is no such thing as a perfect performance.

A painter creates in his or her own studio and is able to make corrections and additions to their

work before the public is allowed to see it. Then it becomes a permanent work of art that can

exist for many years.

The people who produce the Mass and its music have to do some preparatory work, to be sure. However, the art of the Liturgy only exists when all aspects are in place: the Mass, music and the congregation's participation. We run the risk or having things go wrong in the present because we



are a living, breathing work of art; correcting and adding to it each time we take the time to experience it.

We are not perfect people; we bring our brokenness to the Lord's table each week to seek His sustenance and grace through the Liturgy. God's light shines mightily through the shards of our brokenness, and there is beauty beyond belief in this imperfection.


