- ✓ Call Cemetery Contact to view available cemetery plots and make selection
- ✓ Contact the Church Office for pricing and to pay for plot
- ✓ Approval of monument design must be obtained from Cemetery Contact

Guidelines

- ✓ One (1) full casket
- ✓ One (1) full casket and one (1) urn of cremated remains per plot (not an option at Calvary Cemetery, Wisconsin Dells, WI)
- ✓ Two (2) urns of cremated remains per plot

Other Information

Prior to ANY burial, you must contact our Church Office and Parochial Pastor.

Only authorized personnel, as approved by the Parochial Pastor, are allowed to open or close a grave. Digging and/or placing a monument on a plot is strictly forbidden without the express permission of the Parochial Pastor and Cemetery Contact.

All Burials in a Catholic Cemetery must have a Catholic Priest present.

A Catholic Cemetery is a sacred place, and if a faithful Catholic is a long-time member of a parish with a cemetery, the presumption is that they will be buried there. You can keep your burial plans and preferences on file at each church for easy access when you are called to the Lord. A Catholic cemetery is the resting place for those who are baptized, who worshipped and lived their Christian faith, and in death complete their baptismal commitment at rest with their fellow companions in faith.



Bequests

You may be looking for a way to make a significant gift to support our Pastorate. A bequest is a gift made through your will or trust. It is one of the most popular and flexible ways that you can support our Churches and Schools.

A bequest is generally a revocable gift, which means it can be changed or modified at any time. You can choose to designate that a bequest be used for a general or specific purpose so you have the peace of mind knowing that your gift will be used as intended. Bequests are exempt from federal estate taxes. If you have a taxable estate, the estate tax charitable deduction may offset or eliminate estate taxes, resulting in a larger inheritance for your heirs.
