Weekly Reflection

God Is With Us, Always

So often in our society—and yes, even in our own parish—we operate from a place of scarcity. We worry about how we'll pay the bills, put food on the table, cover rent or the mortgage. We don't just worry about today, but about tomorrow, the day after that, next week, next month. With prices climbing and financial stability harder to come by, it's easy to feel overwhelmed. But today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus invites us to look to God—and to each other—to meet our needs. We do the same in our families, our communities, our parish, and in the broader Church. Sometimes we are so anxious about the worries of tomorrow that we forget to go to God first. Scripture tells us we need only ask, have faith, and YES—GOD WILL PROVIDE! Even the Apostles were ready to send the crowd away. And how often are we—especially those of us in ministry or service—tempted to do the same? When the needs feel too big, when the budget feels too small, when our energy runs low, our first instinct can be to turn people away, to say “no” because the resources just aren't there. But Jesus interrupts that instinct. He tells the Apostles, “Give them something to eat.” And then, he provides in ways they never imagined.

That's the heart of today's solemnity: the Body and Blood of Christ, given freely and fully for our sake. The miracle of the loaves and fishes isn't just about feeding a hungry crowd. It points us to the Eucharist, where Jesus blesses, breaks, and gives himself to us again and again. This is not a God who runs out. This is a God of abundance. When was the last time you truly went hungry? Not just fasting, or waiting for lunch to start, but truly without—because there was no food? That's the kind of hunger the five thousand men, women, and children felt after following Jesus into the wilderness. The disciples, anxious and tired, wanted to send them away. But Jesus had another plan.

We do the same thing. In our families, in our ministries, in our parish—we fear there won't be enough. Not enough money, not enough help, not enough time. We brace ourselves to say no. To turn others away. But then Jesus tells us what he told the disciples: “Give them some food yourselves.” And what happens next changes everything. He takes what little they have—five loaves and two fish—blesses it, breaks it, and gives it back to them. Suddenly there is more than enough. Not just enough to get by. Enough to satisfy. Enough to overflow.

This is what we celebrate today on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: that God gave us his Son to feed us—really feed us—with his own Body and Blood. This miracle wasn't just a meal. It was a foretaste of the Eucharist, where Jesus gives himself to us completely, over and over again. So when you're anxious, when you're not sure how you'll provide for those you love, when fear and doubt creep in—remember the thousands in the wilderness. Remember the breaking of bread. And remember: God will provide.

This week, reflect on the abundance of Christ's love for you. Remember that even after you've received all you need, there will still be plenty baskets left over.
