Weekly Reflection

Who is my neighbor?

When we think of the original audience of Jesus's public ministry, he was teaching fellow Jews who were deeply familiar with what the Jewish Scriptures required of them: to love the Lord their God with all their heart, soul, strength, and mind. But Jesus affirmed that this commandment could not stand alone. In Luke's Gospel, he connected it to another essential command: to love one's neighbor as oneself. For Jews at that time, being asked to show compassion to a Samaritan was an extraordinary challenge. Jews and Samaritans were enemies, divided by centuries of hostility and religious disputes. Yet, in Jesus's parable, it is the Samaritan, not the priest or the Levite, who chooses to show mercy to a complete stranger. His compassion was unexpected, radical, and deeply unsettling for Jesus's audience. Two thousand years later, the call to extend the same compassion, care, and mercy to strangers, even those who oppose us or make us uncomfortable, is still radical. If we are honest with ourselves, we know that loving our enemies remains one of the most difficult parts of following Jesus. Yet Jesus makes it clear: this is not optional. It is how we inherit eternal life and live as citizens of his Kingdom. Last week, we heard the joyful message that our names are already written in Heaven. But this week reminds us that this heavenly citizenship demands action. We cannot claim to love God if we refuse to love those around us, regardless of who they are. Love is a word we often use lightly. We say we love our families, our favorite sports teams, our cherished desserts. But loving our neighbor goes deeper. Loving our neighbor means choosing to seek their good, to wish blessings and grace for them even if they've hurt us, spoken badly about us, or treated us **unfairly.** True love looks beyond how someone makes us feel and instead desires what is best for them, no matter the cost. Living in Vallejo, we know this isn't easy. This can be a tough city marked by struggles, differences, and sometimes deep divisions. Yet this is precisely where God has planted us, and it's here that Jesus calls us to live out this radical love. We're called to love not only those who belong to our parish or share our neighborhood, racial identity, or faith community, but everyone we encounter. It is in this place, with all its challenges, that we are invited to become true neighbors, bringing Christ's compassion into every corner of our city. Use this week and your interactions with people you might not normally expect to help, just as the Good Samaritan helped the injured man who was his enemy, to show others the radical, transformative love that Jesus has commanded us to share.
