Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...



Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

A perplexing statement appears to be made by St. Paul in today's Second Reading taken from his Letter to the Colossians: "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up

what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of His Body, which is the Church" (Col. 1:24).

At first hearing, we can be unsettled by his rejoicing in suffering. "How can there be joy in suffering?" we may easily begin to think. Anesthetized to suffering and pain in a world that recoils against it, many would be flummoxed by St. Paul's statement; though as men and women of goodwill we may find natural virtue in suffering for another's sake. Certainly a mother and father would eagerly bear suffering in place of a beloved child who has just fallen off his bicycle.

With a great sense of altruism, we could imagine ourselves as generous if we were to be denied some pleasure as we help another in need, but it is not merely of natural goodness to which we are called but an even higher standard. We are to be as good as Jesus Himself. As Christians we will raise the banner that is the Cross and give thanks to God who has allowed Himself to be crucified for our sake. Here now suffering must have met its end, right?

But then we hear St. Paul's continued comments: "and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ". Did not Jesus suffer and die for our sins? Is He not the perfect Son of God ... How could anything be lacking in Him?!

Here then we are struck with an even deeper realization. It is not just that we believe in Jesus who died for our sins long ago, as some isolated act, but that we believe in His perpetual self-gift, an act of perfect sacrifice, in which we are invited to share in Him, with Him, and through Him. As we receive and enter into the Body of Christ, the sufferings of the world are borne on the Cross as a living sacrifice. We are and can be united with Jesus Christ in a total and abundant way, not merely emulating Him in His goodness, but thoroughly sharing in His suffering and death, thereby authentically sharing in His Resurrection and eternal life!

The Body of Christ, that is the Church, suffers in the world today in Her members. The child that falls off the bicycle. The spouse who bears the terminal diagnosis of a loved one. The mother and father whose newborn baby dies so young.

Yet the Body of Christ, that is the Church, triumphs eternally in the glory of Heaven, united in life and death with the One who united Himself to us in life and death. It is not merely the good that we do in this life, suffering along the way to do it, but rather drawing intimately and close, in Spirit and Flesh, to the One who is Goodness itself.

We are to be as Jesus Himself.

REFLECT

At the end of this month, the Church will celebrate the Jubilee of Young People as part of the Holy Year reflecting on the virtue of hope. Young adults are invited to make a pilgrimage to Rome or observe the Jubilee celebration in their local diocese. Our recent Holy Fathers have emphasized the special role that young people have in the Church, with Pope St. John Paul II establishing World Youth Day as an international gathering of the young Church to inspire and encourage them in their faith. The Papal Bull for the Holy Year encourages us, "With renewed passion, let us demonstrate care and concern for adolescents, students and young couples, the rising generation. Let us draw close to the young, for they are the joy and hope of the Church and of the world!"

Despite the increasing challenges that young people face in our world today, Pope Francis has called young adults to be pilgrims of hope. For "Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love." When we consider the battle for life, hope is essential in all our efforts to build a culture that welcomes, protects, and celebrates the gift of human life. Amidst increasing threats to human life, the young must carry forth the truth that every human life made in the image and likeness of God has innate value and infinite dignity. We pray that the Church, through the witness of the young, may "always be prepared to defend the rights of those who are most vulnerable."

There are some exciting changes and updates to our Calvary Cemetery we would like to share this summer! A few weeks ago, we shared pictures and information on three new trees planted in various sections of Calvary with the help of our First Communion Classes of 2023, 2024, & 2025. We


planted a Flame Thrower Eastern Redbud, a Red Maple, and a River Birch. It was great to see the students take ownership of these trees and plant them as a representation of their own growing faith.



While that was taking place we repaired and reinstalled water to a new spigot adjacent to the west gate. As of early July, water is running to the spigot again, making care and maintenance of our new trees and plantings vastly easier. These were both significant projects, and we are thrilled they have been

completed. We look forward to everyone being able to enjoy these improvements for years to come.

With these two projects behind us we are looking to our next, and largest, project - a




beautification and burial plot plan for the section of Calvary by our existing Altar. After seeking interested landscape bids, the Cemetery Commission has developed a plan of

varied shrubbery, trees, and flower plantings with spacing for monumented cremation and full burial lots near these new garden areas. Great care was taken in selecting the tree and flower varieties that will flourish in our climate and on our cemetery grounds as well as ensuring plentiful open space for Mass to be held for our parishioners at the altar and space to visit family plots. An extension of the newly repaired water line is also planned to ensure these new plantings can grow strong roots and thrive.

We are grateful for your continued support as we work to enhance the beauty and function of Calvary Cemetery for our parish community.






