Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...



Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

Sacred Scripture teaches us an interesting albeit hard lesson today. The invincible depths of God's life and love can not measure according to human calculations, but the superabundance of His mercy is a

wellspring bursting forth if you and I just ask for it.

We begin with our father in faith, Abraham, who shows us what it is to be in relationship with God as Lord and Master of the universe. Abraham receives God's promise of a new and enduring inheritance and cooperates with Him in the divine plan. Abraham is us, mere creatures, learning to be in a restored relationship with God, almighty Creator. Abraham is part of our preparation for a redeemed humanity in Christ.

The scandal of sin cries out from the earth, a people separating themselves from God. God knows full well the movements of the heart and the will of man, but He invites Abraham to witness with Him, and therefore learn, how sin tears us away from divine love. "Their sin so grave, that I must go down and see whether or not their actions fully correspond to the cry".

Abraham begins to bargain, seeking to spare the innocent from the guilty. He calculates measures of human goodness as though innocence and guilt coexist. How many innocent among the multitude? Fifty. Forty-Five. Forty. Thirty. Twenty. Ten ...

Not even ten are found. The measure is not an accommodation of human goodness in the balance with evil, but a realization of our total reliance, and therefore capacity, for divine goodness Itself. God is sheer Goodness, pure Spirit, supreme Being. Anything less and He would not BE. God is perfect Being itself. With God, it's all or nothing!

This stark but true realization can lead many to despair and despondence. How could we ever approach the awesome power and life of God?

Yet, indeed we can ...

"I tell you, ask you and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Lk. 11:9).

God invites us to witness life with Him. To live and come to be as He is. Yes, at times we'll wander, sometimes innocent and sometimes guilty, but we can always ask, always seek, always knock, and so find Him again. Each of us must make the choice

ourselves. Each of us must will it, but let us not forget what the Good Lord says:

"How much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him" ...

Most Holy Trinity, I adore You! My God, I love you in the Most Blessed Sacrament!

CELEBRATE SAINTS MARTHA, MARY, & LAZARUS.

July 29th marks the Feast Day of Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus. These three are the patron saints of siblings. These siblings teach us an incredibly powerful reminder of faith in times of hardship. Their moving story is all about trusting God even when things seem impossible - They demonstrate the power and strength that comes from believing in something bigger than ourselves. To honor their feast day, we're sharing their story and four simple ways to celebrate!

The Story of Saints Martha, Mary, & Lazarus

Martha, Mary and Lazarus are three siblings who were close friends to Jesus. During Lazarus' death, we learn just how faithful Martha

and Mary were to Jesus and how meaningful their friendship was. Saint Martha is most well-known for her strong faith in Jesus after her brother's death. Jesus told her "I am the Resurrection and the Life; whoever believes in Me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?' She said to Him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that You are the Messiah, the Son of God, the One Who is coming into the world" (John 11:25-27).

Saint Martha loved to host Jesus and prepare meals for Him, whereas Saint Mary loved to listen to His words. In addition, in John 12:1-8, it describes Mary's anointing of Jesus' feet at Bethany, one act that He praised highly.

Saint Lazarus was killed by the chief priests because of his strong belief in Jesus. Lazarus was the one of whom the Jews said, "See how much he loved Him." Upon his death, Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead.

Their faithfulness is truly inspiring!

The Significance Of This Feast Day

In February 2021, Pope Francis declared a combined Feast Day of Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus to be celebrated each year on July 29th. It is stated in Pope Francis' decree that, "In the household of Bethany, the Lord Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and for this reason the Gospel of John states that He loved them. Martha generously offered Him hospitality, Mary listened attentively to His words and Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of the One Who humiliated death."

4 Simple Ways To Celebrate

- Celebrate your siblings There's no better way to celebrate this feast day than honoring your own siblings! If you don't have siblings, celebrate close friends or family that are like siblings to you. A few ways to honor your siblings include: Spend time together without distractions; Be fully present and enjoy your time together. Call or send your siblings a simple message expressing your gratitude for them or express how much they mean to you. Thank your siblings for the joy they bring into your life or how they have influenced you to be a better sibling/person. Plan a sibling-only trip to one of your favorite places. Most importantly, say a prayer for your siblings.
- Be Hospitable Like Martha According to the decree by Pope Francis, "Martha generously offered Him hospitality..." In honor of Martha's spirit, open your heart up to strangers and offer them friendship and hospitality. You can do this by cooking a meal for someone you think could really use it (a friend that is struggling, a sick family member, etc.), or someone you'd love to bless. Plan a dinner party at your house and cook a delicious meal, while offering a safe space for friendship, connection and community.
- Sit with Jesus like Mary of Bethany Pope Francis' decree also stated that, "Mary listened attentively to His words..." One way to sit with Jesus is by spending time reading scripture. Read and digest His words, meditate on His messages and reflect on how you can incorporate His teaching into your daily life. Set a time for 15 minutes to read the scriptures. Turn off all distractions so you can be fully present with Jesus. End your quiet time with a prayer of thanks.
- Rise Up Like Lazarus Lastly, Pope Francis' decree acknowledged that, "Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of the One Who humiliated death..."

Ask yourself this question: Jesus commanded Lazarus to rise up from his grave. This is a command for you - What are the dead parts inside of you that need to rise up like Lazarus? What do you need to let go of to make room for more love? (beaheart.com)




