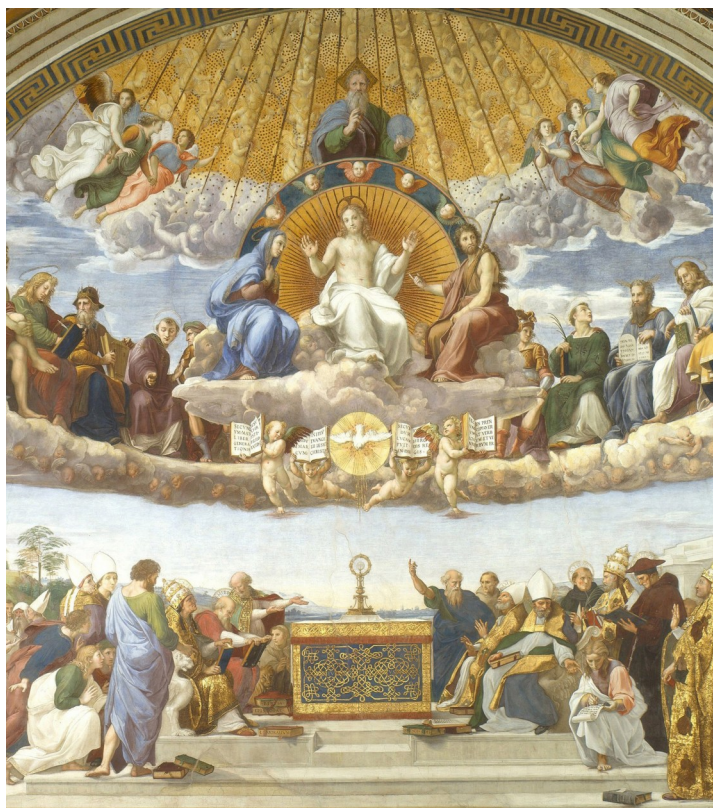

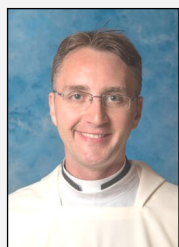

Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...



Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

"The LORD is a God of justice, who knows no favorites" (Sir 35). Our readings begin today with an awareness of divine equanimity. The balance of heavenly grace is equally open to all without favor, affection, malice, or ill will. Whether a British soldier or public official, whether rich businessman or poor schoolchild, whether cloistered religious or faithful spouse, each and every one of us have an equal hearing before God.

The question therefore becomes: do each and every one of us recognize our lowliness and foster a desire to reach out to the LORD?

"The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest till it reaches its goal".

In the Gospel, one person is convinced of his own righteousness, praising himself. The other is humble, acknowledging his sin. With humility, he prayed. "O God, be merciful to me a sinner" (Lk 18:13). For praise, glory, and honor, turn to the Lord and not to yourself.

You and I, dear friends, have the awesome power of prayer. Described by St. Teresa of Avila as like nothing more than the intimate conversation between close friends, prayer is our open heart before God with humility and trust. God wills your good. Always.

SAINTS SIMON & JUDE—FEAST DAY OCTOBER 28TH

St. Jude Thaddeus and St. Simon, two of the least known Apostles, are paradoxically among the closest to their Master, two of His cousins. At least, the tradition is quite certain of it as regards Jude Thaddeus, since it is clear from the Scriptures that his father, Alpheus, was the brother of St. Joseph, while his mother, Mary Cleophas, was a cousin of the Virgin. As for Simon, things are shrouded in fog.

MANY FACES, AN APOSTLE

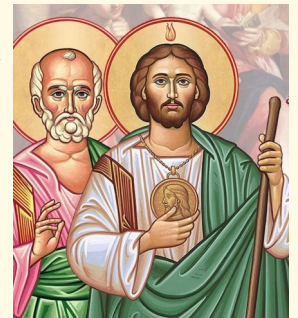
The Gospel names St. Simon as the tenth apostle, just before Jude Thaddeus. Many identify in Simon the homonymous cousin of Christ, brother of James the Younger. The Byzantines identify in him Nathanael of Cana and the canteen director at the wedding of Cana, while St. Fortunatus of Poitiers states that Simon and Jude Thaddeus were buried in Suanir, a city in Persia, where they suffered martyrdom. According to tradition, it is almost certainly in this part of the world that Simon, known as the Zealot or the Canaanite, as the evangelists Matthew and Mark call him, crossed paths with Jude Thaddeus, who would be his companion in mission until the end.

JUDE, THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

When the Eleven dispersed from Jerusalem to proclaim the Kingdom of God in other lands, Jude Thaddeus departed from Galilee and Samaria to go into Syria, Armenia and ancient Persia. In this area, authoritative sources claim, he met Simon, and their missionary partnership won tens of thousands of Babylonians and people from other cities for Christ. As always, the Gospel earned for itself both followers and enemies: for the two Apostles, the hour of supreme witness eventually arrived.

THE COURAGE TO BE CALLED CHRISTIANS

Arrested and taken to the Temple of the Sun, the sentence imposed on both was to worship the goddess Diana, and so to deny Christ. In refusing, it is said that Jude Thaddeus declared pagan idols false, and that at the same time two horrible demons came out of the temple, destroying him. Frightened, the people watching the scene are said to have pounced ferociously on the two Apostles, who are brutally killed. Their relics are kept in the Basilica of Saint Peter.

MASSACHUSETTS COOL CORRIDORS GRANT NEWS RELEASE

October 15, 2025

[GREENFIELD, MA OCTOBER 15, 2025] — With funding from a Massachusetts Cool Corridors Grant, tree planting along Beacon Street, Sanderson Street, High Street, and Federal Streets is set to begin Friday, October 17. Trees will also be planted along interior streets and near parking lots and outdoor gathering areas. More than 70 trees, including 56 shade trees and 15 small stature trees, will be planted this fall and spring.

The project location is comprised of a 25-acre neighborhood that includes public tree belts in front of homes as well as areas around the Greenfield Middle School, Baystate Franklin Medical Center, Blessed Trinity Parish's Blessed Sacrament Church & Pastoral Center, as well as City offices, medical offices, and small businesses. The project area is entirely within an EEA Statewide LST Index "Hot Spot," due to various conditions, including very low tree cover, very high impervious surface cover, severe heat island effect and more. These conditions point to the need for planting trees for the cooling effects they will provide to the neighborhood and on walking routes in particular. The Commonwealth and the City of Greenfield recognize that tree planting is an important cooling strategy as the climate warms.

Amherst Nurseries was awarded the contract for tree installation, watering, and maintenance of the street trees. The company grows trees, shrubs, and perennials on over 100 acres in Amherst and Hadley, and offers complete landscaping services. Amherst Nurseries' two-person crew will plant primarily native trees, including staking, watering and mulching each tree. While the goal is to plant shade trees wherever possible for maximum cooling benefits, small stature trees will be planted where there are overhead utility lines. Tree planting will take around four weeks to complete (October through mid-November). Amherst Nurseries will return for tree watering as needed, through June 2027.

The City of Greenfield was awarded the funding through an Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA), Cool Corridors Grant. The program is designed to make funding available for community tree planting projects, specifically targeting neighborhoods with documented urban heat islands, hotspots and/or areas that suffer from surges of extreme heat. The Greenfield Department of Public Works and the Greenfield Tree Committee (GTC), partnered to develop the project proposal. GTC, an all-volunteer, non-profit organization, works with the city and residents to increase the number and quality of trees in the city. GTC volunteers will assist in tree monitoring during the project.

NOTE FROM DEACON GEORGE, PARISH MANAGER

Blessed Trinity's Beacon Street campus is receiving nine new trees through this grant. The new trees will be Pin Oak, Bur Oak, Firefall Maple, & Honey Locust trees. We are grateful to the town of Greenfield for their attention to the area around our Pastoral Center & Blessed Sacrament Church and their hard work in bringing this project to fruition.

FEASTS OF ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS: THEIR SPECIAL MEANING FOR CATHOLICS

During the month of November, the Church remembers in a particular way all those who have died, as She celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints and that of All Souls' Day.

All Saints' Day is celebrated each year on Nov. 1, a day on which we honor all the Saints in heaven, both those known and unknown. All Saints' Day is also a Holy Day of Obligation, meaning all Catholics are required to attend Mass on that day.

Bishop Frank J. Dewane said, "the celebration of All Saints' Day reminds us that we are all called to holiness, to become Saints, and we can accomplish that by striving to follow God's commands and being united with Him in love. To be holy, to be a Saint, means allowing God 'to live his life in us' as Mother Teresa taught."



Pope Francis said the Saints were not "starched," picture-perfect conformists, but were "countercultural and revolutionary." The Holy Father added that the multitude of men and women honored on the feast of All Saints lived according to the Eight Beatitudes, which made them decidedly out of place in the world.

Having a Saint to pray to is an important component of one's faith life, Bishop Dewane said. One can pray to the Saint after whom you are named, but if someone is not named after a Saint, praying to the Saint of one's chosen middle, or even the Saint of one's Confirmation is appropriate. An alternative is to pray to the Saint after which your Parish is named, or even one who is a patron of a particular profession or interest you are pursuing.

There are four Diocesan Parishes which have Feast Days in November. First, Nov. 4 is the Memorial of St. Charles Borromeo, Bishop (Parish and School in Port Charlotte); Nov. 10 is the Memorial of St. Leo the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church (Parish in Bonita Springs); Nov. 13 is the Memorial of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (Parish in Parrish); and Nov. 22 is the Memorial of St. Cecilia, Virgin and Martyr (Parish in Fort Myers).

"Learn about these Saints that are a part of your life," Bishop Dewane said. "Read about the extraordinary story behind their being named a Saint. As Pope Francis often states, the Saints can offer examples for our lives. This greater accessibility to a particular Saint can help enhance one's prayer life and opens our hearts to seek their intercession when we are lost in the world."

The commemoration of the Feast of All Souls, or the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, is celebrated on Nov. 2, for all the souls who await the joys in heaven.

"It is encouraged that you pray for immediate family members, those closest to you, who have gone before us. Continue to pray for them as they make their way to Heaven, to be with Jesus Christ, Our Lord," Bishop Dewane said. "Through the prayers of the faithful on earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven. May all those who have died in faith share the joys and blessings of the life to come."

During November, it is encouraged to have a Mass offered for the intention of the soul of someone who has died. In addition, an indulgence is granted the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one from Nov. 1 through Nov. 8 and can be gained on each one of these days.

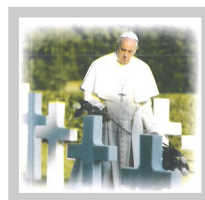

ALL SOULS ENVELOPES

November is All Souls month. Our custom is to put the envelopes with names of your beloved dead on our Altars for the entire month.
