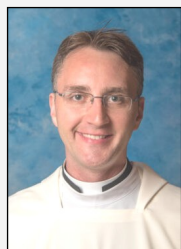

Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...



Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

This weekend we celebrate once again a feast of the Lord which takes precedence over a Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today we mark the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome.

This may be a feast you are not much familiar with on the calendar, but the reality it celebrates is surely one known to us through and through. In a way, today we rejoice in the presence of the Church standing boldly in the world.

Until the early 4th century, it was a death sentence to be Christian. Small communities would hide together to receive baptism, celebrate Mass, and learn of our new hope and life in Christ. The successors of the apostles, that is bishops, and the ever-expanding community of faithful practiced the faith in secret. If they were found out, they were exiled and even killed.

In the early 300s, the ruler of the world, the emperor Constantine reversed the course of the centuries and received baptism himself. The hidden Church came out of the shadows and became free. Furthermore, Constantine granted to the Bishop of Rome, that is the Pope, a place from which he could publicly preach and pray. That is the Lateran Basilica.

The Papal Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and Sts. John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran (or St. John Lateran for short) has been the seat of the Church's presence and authority in the world for over 1700 years. After fires in the 1300s and reconstruction in the 1600s, we can still visit and pray in the Lateran Basilica today.

I share this with you as we ourselves gather each week in the physical reflection of the People of God, that is the Church, present in the world. Here at Blessed Trinity Church our buildings have names too, Blessed Sacrament, Holy Trinity, Fr. Casey Hall, Knights of Columbus Conference Room, and more. Here on Main Street and Federal Street we can freely and faithfully pray, learn the Word of God, and fulfill the mission of sanctification each day. This is no small feat. This is not isolated.

We are part of the very history of the Church and it is our duty to faithfully maintain the work of the salvation of souls in our own day, not just a building.

Last weekend we received the Annual Report of our parish. As you doubtless noticed, Building

Improvements, Repairs and Maintenance, Utilities and the care of our campuses, make up hundreds of thousands of dollars of expenses each year. For every \$20 bill you put in the basket, almost half goes to the regular upkeep and maintenance of our buildings and grounds alone.

Thank you for your care of these facilities, but thank you all the more for your investment in the work that happens in them and through them. The churches stand so that we may stand, sit, and kneel within them. May that work of prayer and sacrifice truly expand and continue all the more robustly.

PEACE IN PATOKA: A VETERANS DAY REFLECTION

A number of years ago, I was driving through Southern Illinois and passed through the rural village of Patoka. I knew I had heard that name before.

A short pullover for gas and coffee jolted my memory: it was the hometown of Lance Corporal Torrey Gray, USMC.

Torrey and I served together in 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, 1st Marine Division. On April 11, 2004, Torrey was killed in Fallujah, Iraq. He ran directly into hostile fire to save the life of an injured Marine. He was just 19 years old.

I pulled into the bucolic cemetery, hoping to pay my respects at Torrey's grave. It was not hard to find. Fellow Marines had also made the pilgrimage to Patoka, leaving behind memories and mementos: a handwritten letter in a sealed Ziplock bag, personal dog tags, the Marine Corps "eagle, globe, and anchor" pin, to list a few. I did not have anything to leave at Torrey's grave that day, but I did water it with my tears.

On the day of Torrey's death, I served as a casualty reporter at unit headquarters. I helped to write the report that made its way from the distant battlefield to Torrey's house in Patoka, delivered to his mother by a local Marine Corps liaison and family minister. To stand at his grave now, as the sun rose on a crisp spring morning, was very healing for my soul.

Torrey's death in 2004 also occurred on Easter Sunday that year. The holiest day of the Christian year—when we celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death—was the day Torrey entered eternal life. His final act personified the words of Christ the night before his own death: *"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends"* (Jn 15:13).

President Ronald Reagan once observed that the "imagination plays a trick" when we remember our beloved war dead: *"We see them as something like the Founding Fathers, grave and gray haired. But most of them were boys when they died, and they gave up two lives—the one they were living and the one they would have lived."*

This Sunday, I will be running the Freedom 5k for my buddy Torrey and for all fallen Marines throughout our 250 year history (our birthday is November 10th). If you can't join us in person, please join us in spirit, especially a spirit of prayer, for all our beloved dead who gave their lives in generous service to our nation and for our freedom.

HISTORY OF THE DEDICATION OF SAINT JOHN LATERAN BASILICA

Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the Pope's main church, but they are wrong. Saint John Lateran is the Pope's church, the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides.

The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when Constantine donated land he had received from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake, and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where Popes were consecrated. In the 14th century when the papacy returned to Rome from Avignon, the church and the adjoining palace were found to be in ruins.



Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. One of Rome's most imposing churches, the Lateran's towering facade is crowned with 15 colossal statues of Christ, John the Baptist, John the Evangelist, and 12 doctors of the Church. Beneath its high altar rest the remains of the small wooden table on which tradition holds Saint Peter himself celebrated Mass.

Reflection

Unlike the commemorations of other Roman churches, this anniversary is a feast. The dedication of a church is a feast for all its parishioners. In a sense, St. John Lateran is the parish church of all Catholics, because it is the pope's cathedral. This church is the spiritual home of the people who are the Church. (www.franciscanmedia.org)

Our Holy Trinity Church

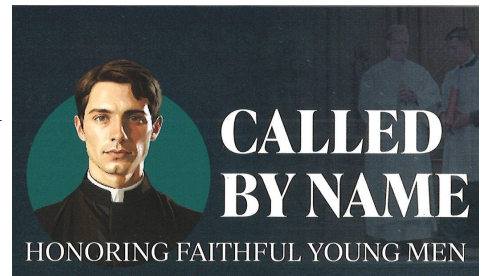
Advent is the perfect time to prepare our souls for the coming of Christmas. This special Communal Penance Service provides a time to go to
