Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...



Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

As I walked on a recent Tuesday from our Parish Offices to the polling place at the high school, I was waiting at the intersection for the signal to change.

A young lady with three schoolchildren also came up and they were joyfully recounting the activities of the day. As we waited patiently on the curb with traffic buzzing by, the woman affirmed to the children they are safe and won't be struck as the cars make their turns or travel their way, to which I heard one of the children exclaim "Because they know the rules ..."

In the lilt of a child's voice, I'm not sure if the comment "Because they know the rules ..." was a question or a declaration. I didn't hear any further response from the mother or caregiver but the logic of the child was evident. Together respecting the rules of society, we can be safe as activities of life flow unhindered and free.

Yet it also seems our society doesn't always follow the same rules or at least less so than times past. Even basic traffic laws are flouted and I was disheartened to see grown adults jaywalking the busy street while we waited at the light. What example are we giving the children of our town?

Our readings this weekend reflect an expectant waiting. We hear that tumult and disorder will rule the days to come but "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Are we men and women of patience or do we contribute to the chaos? Do we live in anticipation of greater things or do even the small things of daily living consume us and our peaceability.

Too often Federal Street seems to function as a multi-lane highway with cars speedily passing another vehicle making a left or right turn. Can we drivers not wait a brief moment and let the person ahead complete their turn?

Too easily pedestrians meander the middle of Main Street (or worse, drivers wave them on) and too many close calls have been witnessed yet remain unlearned. Can we walkers not use the crosswalk just a few more steps away? Is it really such an inconvenience for us to walk those few extra feet or are we so proud and full of hubris that our time is more valuable than another's?

I share these observations, not as a curmudgeon, but as an ever-hopeful champion of civilization. Yes! Even in its most basic actions, we can build up

human civilization and social dynamism or we can easily contribute to its downfall.

The orange stop hand signal changed to a white walk sign, while all the cars had paused at a red light, and we started on our way crossing opposite streets at the intersection. The child's civilizational comment lingering in my thoughts ...

SAINT ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY



Saint Elizabeth was born a princess of Hungary in 1207, probably in Pressburg, Hungary [now Bratislava, Slovakia] and died November 17, 1231, Marburg, Thuringia [now Hesse, Germany]. She was canonized in 1235. Her feast day is celebrated on November 17th.

Saint Elizabeth whose devotion to the poor (for whom she relinquished her wealth) made her an enduring symbol of Christian charity, of which she is a patron saint.

The daughter of King Andrew II of Hungary, Elizabeth was betrothed in infancy to Louis IV, son of Hermann I, landgrave of Thuringia, at whose court she was brought up. The marriage, which occurred when Louis succeeded his father in 1221, proved to be ideal but brief. Louis died in 1227 of plague at Otranto (Italy) en route to the Sixth Crusade. When his brother Henry assumed the regency, Elizabeth left and took refuge with her uncle, Bishop Eckbert of Bamberg.

No longer caring for position or wealth, she joined the Third Order of St. Francis, a lay Franciscan group. At Marburg she built a hospice for the poor and sick, to whose service she devoted the rest of her life. She put herself under the spiritual direction of Konrad von Marburg, an ascetic of incredible harshness and severity, who belonged to no specific religious order. She died before her 24th birthday in 1231 and was canonized just four years later.

Among the best-known legends about Elizabeth is one often depicted in art that shows her meeting her husband unexpectedly on one of her charitable errands. In this legend the loaves of bread she was carrying were miraculously changed into roses. This transformation convinced him of the worthiness of her kind endeavors, about which he had been chiding her. www.britannica.com






