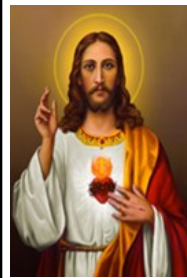

Traveling Blessed Mother Statue

For over 40 years, Sacred Heart Parish has had the tradition of a traveling statue of our Lady of Grace. Also in our parish, since Renew 2000, a traveling statue of Our Lady of Fatima was purchased. This means a family or person signs up to have her on a particular date. You pray the rosary anytime of day in front of our Lady's image in your home. No prayer is more powerful than the rosary; from our lips to her ears, she takes our intentions and brings them to her son, Jesus. What better intercessor than her! If you wish to participate in this tradition, please leave your name and phone number at the Service Desk. Someone will contact you to determine which you want - Our Lady of Grace or Our Lady of Fatima - and when each is available. When your hosting of the statue is over, you can either take her to the next person's house or simply put her in the Usher's closet in the vestibule for that person to pick up. Thank you for your faith and trust in our Blessed Mother and may we continue this tradition for many more years to come.
