

Cay Galgon's Mission


We prepare pregnant women and mothers of infants for a life of self-reliance.

St. Maximillian Kolbe



St Maximillian Kolbe was born in 1894 in Poland. As a teenager, he joined the Franciscan Order and was Ordained a Priest. During World War II he served as the superior of a monastery in Poland, which included a small hospital. He hid refugees fleeing the Nazis including 2,000 Jews. On February 17, 1941 the Nazis shut down the monastery, the hospital and arrested Father Kolbe. He was sent to the death camp at Auschwitz. As punishment for the successful escape of one prisoner, the Nazi Commandant ordered the execution of ten randomly selected prisoners. One of the condemned men, Franciszek Gajowniczek, cried aloud about his concern for his wife and children. Father Kolbe, who had not been condemned, volunteered to take Franciszek's place.

Franciszek, survived the War and was present in 1982, when Pope John Paul II proclaimed Father Kolbe to be a Saint and Martyr.
