"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." (Luke 14:13-14) One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

This weekend's Gospel reminds us of one of the hardest yet most beautiful virtues to live: humility. Jesus tells us, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." The world around us often pushes us to seek recognition, to climb higher, to be noticed and praised. But Jesus invites us to take the lower place, to serve rather than be served, to give without expecting anything in return.

Humility does not mean thinking less of ourselves; it means thinking of ourselves less often, and leaving space in our hearts for God and others. A humble person does not need the seat of honor, because they know their true worth comes from God.

This Gospel also challenges us in a very practical way: *Whom do we invite to our table?* Jesus tells us not to invite only those who can pay us back, but also those who cannot—the poor, the forgotten, the lonely. It is a call to widen our circle and to love without conditions. In our parish, we see opportunities for this every day: when we welcome a newcomer, when we reach out to someone who is grieving, when we serve the needy in our community.

Let us encourage ourselves this week to make a small but intentional choice for humility:

- · Give thanks to God for a gift or talent you have, and use it quietly to bless someone.
- · Choose the less comfortable seat so another can have the better one.
- · Invite or include someone who usually feels left out.

When we live this way, we reflect the heart of Christ Himself, who humbled Himself to share in our humanity so that we might share in His divinity.

Let us keep walking together in humility, trusting that God's reward is far greater than human praise.
