Dear Friends.

The Gospel this Sunday is one of the most demanding teachings of Jesus: "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Jesus reminds us that discipleship is not a hobby, not something we fit into our schedule when convenient, but a whole way of life. It asks for courage, sacrifice, and a willingness to put Christ first above all else.

At first, this may sound harsh. Jesus even says that to follow Him, we must "hate" father, mother, spouse, children, even our own life. He is not calling us to despise our loved ones, but rather to love Him above all—and by doing so, to love our family, friends, and even ourselves more authentically.

When Christ is at the center, all other relationships are purified, strengthened, and ordered toward what is good. We all carry crosses: illness, grief, financial burdens, struggles in family life, questions about the future. Jesus is not telling us to pretend these crosses do not exist, but to carry them with Him. The cross is not meant to crush us; it is meant to transform us. When we embrace our cross with faith, it becomes the very path by which we grow in holiness and discover deeper peace.

Discipleship also means planning wisely. In the Gospel, Jesus gives the image of a builder calculating the cost before starting construction, or a king considering whether he can win the battle. To follow Christ, we must be intentional. We cannot live on "half-commitments." Faith must guide our choices, our use of time, our priorities.

So how can we live this teaching in daily life?

- **Put Christ first**: Begin your day with prayer, even a short one, asking the Lord to guide your steps.
- **Carry your cross with trust**: Instead of asking "Why me?" try asking, "Lord, how can I walk with You through this?"
- **Plan with faith**: In decisions—about family, work, finances, or leisure—ask first, "Does this help me grow closer to God?"
- **Be a witness**: Our community needs disciples who show by their words and actions that following Jesus is worth everything.

My friends, Jesus is not asking us to give up joy, but to discover true joy that cannot be shaken. The cross always leads to resurrection. If we trust Him, the cost of discipleship becomes the greatest investment of our lives—the path to eternal life.

Let us pray this week for the courage to be intentional disciples, carrying our crosses with hope, and placing Christ at the very center of our lives.
