Greetings (Boozhoo Aaniin)!

Religion is often seen as a very somber affair. Some people oppose applause in church for any reason; others are still annoyed by the exchange of peace at Mass. But the fact is that there is much to rejoice about in our faith. It appears on the face of parents and relatives at a baptism, at First Communion, or at weddings.

Joy may be individual or collective. The latter was exemplified by the exuberant thousands gathered in Times Square at the end of World War II or in Germany with the fall of the Berlin Wall. For Catholics it is evident in a special way in St. Peter's Square on momentous spirited occasions.

Our scriptures today call for rejoicing. Isaiah tells a liberated Jewish people to rejoice in their homeland, especially Jerusalem. In poetic language that is arrestingly bold, Jerusalem becomes the mother nursing her children at her breast and carrying them in her arms. The children are the picture of complete contentment. It is a picture of beloved offspring, confident and secure.

Paul's joy arises from the Spirit of life, which has enabled him to overcome the sinful enticements of the world. The cross of Christ has effectively ended the world's power over him. The era of "peace and mercy" has begun.

The enthusiasm of Jesus' disciples in today's gospel arises from the message they bear, the great "good news" that the era of salvation is at hand. So urgent is their commitment that there is no time to pack provisions. No suitcases, no walking sticks, no sandals, no idle chatter. The time is short and there is much to do. They are to take lodging where it is offered. They are to be completely taken up with their message of peace and forgiveness. Their happiness is not to reside in their power to expel demons but in the fact that they are citizens of the heavenly realm.
