CANAS es un club creado especialmente para adultos mayores de 60 años de edad, donde la experiencia, la amistad y la alegría de vivir se encuentran en cada sesión.

De igual forma ofrecemos temas de evangelización, salud y bienestar. Está ubicado en la parroquia de St Dominic, en la ciudad de Houston Texas. Este club tiene como objetivo ser un espacio de encuentro y recreación para los adultos mayores, en donde puedan reunirse y compartir junto a otros, desarrollando actividades que ayuden a su bienestar y mejoramiento de su calidad de vida, acompañados de temas de evangelización y relaciones familiares.

CANAS is a club created especially for adults over 60 years of age, where experience, friendship and joy of life are found in each session.

We also offer topics of evangelization, health and well-being. It is located in the parish of St Dominic, in the city of Houston, Texas. This club aims to be a meeting and recreation space for older adults, where they can meet and share with others, developing activities that help their well-being and improve their quality of life, accompanied by issues of evangelization and family relationships.

It is worth mentioning that this service is provided by the first generation of AMSIF graduates, who are in charge of carrying out this program.

Meeting days are Tuesdays of each week from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

At CANAS we promote physical activity, working on the body and motor skills through relaxation exercises, stretching, group dynamics: directed dances and free dances.

We encourage socialization by sharing life experiences, reading stories, tales or stories of biblical and religious characters.





In CANAS we carry out physical and intellectual recreation activities, age-appropriate singing, dancing, and board games.

An extra motivation for our seniors are the gatherings we hold on dates such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, Cinco de Mayo, Hispanic Heritage Month, etc. as well as the celebration of their birthdays (at the end of each month we celebrate those who have had their birthdays).

Our Seniors, who range in age from 50's to 90's, like being able to choose from our extensive range of activities.


Our monthly trips have included:

Day Of The Dead All Saints' Day and All Saints' Day

A Catholic Reflection on Life, Death, and Communion

Every year, from October 31st to November 2nd, many cultures around the world observe a period of remembrance for the deceased. In Catholic tradition, this period includes All Saints' Day (November 1st) and All Souls' Day (November 2nd)—two significant celebrations rooted in faith, memory, and the hope of eternal life. In Latin American cultures, especially in Mexico, this period is also marked by the colorful and heartfelt observance known as Día de los Muertos (Day of the Dead).

Though some may view Day of the Dead as a purely cultural or even pre-Christian tradition, its deeper meanings align closely with Catholic teachings on the communion of saints, the resurrection of the body, and the ongoing spiritual connection between the living and the dead.



All Saints' Day: Honoring the Church Triumphant

On November 1st, Catholics celebrate All Saints' Day, a solemn holy day dedicated to all saints-known and unknown-who now enjoy the fullness of eternal life in Heaven. These are the faithful who have fought the good fight, finished the race, and kept the faith (2 Timothy 4:7). The Church calls them the "Church Triumphant", and their lives are models of holiness, courage, and faithfulness. All Saints' Day reminds us that sainthood is not reserved for the famous or canonized; it is a universal call. Every baptized person is called to be holy, to live in friendship with God, and to enter into eternal communion with Him.

All Souls' Day: Praying for the Church Suffering

Following All Saints' Day, on November 2nd, Catholics observe All Souls' Day—a day dedicated to praying for the faithful departed who are still undergoing purification in Purgatory. This is the "Church Suffering", those who have died in God's grace but are not yet fully purified.

Catholics believe in the power of prayer, especially the Mass, to aid the souls in Purgatory in their journey toward Heaven. This practice is rooted in Scripture and tradition, reflecting the deep bond between the living and the dead.

Día de los Muertos: A Cultural **Expression of Catholic Hope**

Día de los Muertos, celebrated from October 31 to November 2, reflects the same core beliefs. Families build ofrendas (altars), light candles, place photos of loved ones, and offer food, flowers (especially marigolds), and prayers. These are not acts of worship of the dead, but acts of love, remembrance, and spiritual solidarity.

Though it incorporates elements of pre-Hispanic customs, Día de los Muertos has been deeply shaped by Catholicism over the centuries. It is, at its heart, a celebration of life beyond death, the resurrection, and the hope of Heaven. It expresses the Catholic understanding that death is not the end, but a transition to a new life in Christ.

The Communion of Saints: One **Family in Christ**

These three observances—All Saints' Day, All Souls' Day, and Day of the Dead —embody the Catholic doctrine of the Communion of Saints, which unites:

- · The Church Triumphant (saints in Heaven),
- · The Church Suffering (souls in Purgatory),
- · And the Church Militant (us, the faithful on Earth).

Conclusion: Faith, Memory, and **Eternal Hope**

The Catholic Church offers profound wisdom in its approach to death—not as something to fear, but as a passage toward the fulfillment of our deepest longing: union with God. All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, together with cultural expressions like Día de los Muertos, help us keep that hope alive.

They invite us not only to remember our loved ones but also to renew our own journey toward holiness. In doing so, we honor the past, embrace the present, and look forward to the eternal joy promised by Christ.

Día de Muertos y Día de Todos los Santos

Cada año, del 31 de octubre al 2 de noviembre, muchas culturas alrededor del mundo se detienen para recordar a sus difuntos. En la tradición católica, este tiempo incluye dos celebraciones muy importantes: el Día de Todos los Santos (1 de noviembre) y el Día de los Fieles Difuntos (2 de noviembre). El 1 de noviembre, la Iglesia celebra a todos los santos, conocidos y desconocidos, que ya gozan de la presencia eterna de Dios en el cielo. A ellos se les llama la Iglesia Triunfante, porque han alcanzado la meta final: la santidad.

Esta solemnidad nos recuerda que todos los bautizados estamos llamados a la santidad, no solo los que han sido canonizados. Ser santo no es algo lejano: es vivir en amistad con Dios, ser fiel en el amor, y perseverar hasta el fin.

Día de los Fieles Difuntos: Orando por la Iglesia Purgante

El 2 de noviembre, la Iglesia conmemora a todos los fieles difuntos, especialmente a aquellos que están en el Purgatorio, en proceso de purificación antes de entrar al cielo. A esta parte del Pueblo de Dios se le llama la Iglesia Purgante o Sufriente.

Como católicos, creemos que nuestras oraciones —especialmente la Santa Misa — pueden ayudar a estas almas en su camino hacia la gloria eterna. Esta práctica está fundamentada en la Sagr Escritura y en la tradición, y expresa nuestro amor y responsabilidad mutua como familia espiritual.

Aunque tiene raíces indígenas, el Día de Muertos ha sido profundamente influenciado por el cristianismo, y refleja la creencia en la vida después de la muerte, la resurrección, y la esperanza en la vida eterna.

Estas tres celebraciones —Día de Todos los Santos, Día de los Fieles Difuntos y Día de Muertos— expresan la doctrina católica de la comunión de los santos, que une:

- · Y la Iglesia Militante (nosotros, los fieles en la tierra).
