1. Contact without Fellowship

- Interactions clear, set roles; power differences are expected and followed;
- "Know your place," accept as assigned;
- · Opportunities unequal and not shared;

- Blames the poor for being poor; your suffering and fate are your own fault;
- See others less than self & my people;
- Our group is deserving; others are not
- Blind/closed to vulnerabilities of others

3. Ill Will toward the "Other"

- Wish them harm indifferent to suffering
- My anger/outrage justifies cruelty
- · Hate blinds me-my role in their suffering
- OK to harm others; less human than me.

4. Spreading Hatred, Fear, Anxiety

- Fueled by anger and resentment
- Claims victimhood to justify anger
- Hate destroys life of hater; contagious;
- Death to the mind, spirit, relationship with God.
