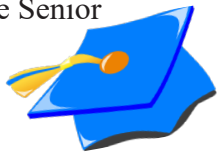

Divine Mercy Sunday

Epiphany will celebrate Divine Mercy **next Sunday, April 12**, in the church. *This years format has changed, Adoration and Confessions will begin at 2:00pm and the Divine Mercy Chaplet will begin at 3:00pm.*



Jesus began appearing to St. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, in 1931. The message and devotion to Jesus as the Divine Mercy is based on her published diary recording the revelations she received from Jesus.

In all, St. Faustina recorded 14 revelations from Jesus concerning His desire for this feast. Since then Divine Mercy has become a loved Catholic Devotion and the Feast was extended to the whole of the Catholic Church on April 30, 2000, with the Canonization of Faustina Kowalska. From that day, the second Sunday of Easter was officially designated as the Sunday of the Divine Mercy in the General Roman Calendar.
