Vicar's Corner

Fr. Edward Hoffmann

It's the time of year for first Communions, and so another good day to think about the Eucharist. I've been reading a good book recently called *Jewish Temple Theology and the Mystery of the Holy Cross*. (As an aside, I really recommend reading about the faith. It's easy to let our knowledge of our faith - the most important thing in our lives - stay at a childish level. Fight this tendency by reading!) This particular book covers a lot of ground, but one of the key ideas in it is the connection between creation and worship. Why did God make the world? We might throw out all sorts of answers, but the Bible's answer is "to have a space for communion." That is, God made the world as a place where we, His creatures, could meet and worship Him. After Adam and Eve ate themselves out of house and home in Eden, the tabernacle and then the temple were meant to take the place of the Garden. In the temple, man could approach God in worship. The sacrifices of the temple were the new means of communion. In fact, the old Hebrew word meaning "to offer sacrifice" (qorban, for all the Hebraists out there) means simply "to draw near." The temple existed to bring God and humanity into communion. In temple worship, we could participate in the whole purpose of creation - communion and worship. Of course, Jesus does this perfectly, by being both God and man, in one person. And Jesus remains with us in the Eucharist to allow us to draw near to God through the sacrificial worship of the Mass. The Eucharist is the most perfect form of "communion" - it allows us not merely to "draw near" to God, but to receive and be received by Him. So, one way we could answer the question, "why did God make the world?" is simply, "The Eucharist." God made the world and us so that we could enter into loving communion with Him. Creation finds its fulfillment at every Mass.

One way to deepen your appreciation of receiving communion is by Eucharistic adoration, where we can "draw near" to God. So much happens during Mass that we can sometimes lose our focus on the essentials. Adoration gives us time to savor the mystery of the Eucharist. When we go to adoration, our participation in Mass (the reason God made the world!) can be more full, conscious, and active. Sign up for a slot during our

Mass Moments

Epiclesis

At one point during a typical Eucharistic Prayer, the priest extends his hands over the bread and wine and prays that the Holy Spirit will change them into the Body and Blood of Christ. We call this prayer by its traditional Greek title, epiclesis.

Prior to the Second Vatican Council, the Roman Catholic Mass did not include a clear epiclesis. It was prominent in all the Eucharistic Prayers of the Eastern Rites of the Church, so one of the changes to the Mass after the council was to include an epiclesis in all the new Eucharistic Prayers currently in use. By calling on the Holy Spirit, the Roman Catholic Church now makes plain what it has always believed, that the bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Christ due to the action of the Spirit.

The new Eucharistic Prayers have another petition concerning the Spirit in their second half. That petition asks the Holy Spirit, who comes upon those who share this Communion, to bind them in unity. The first epiclesis prays for the transformation of the bread and wine; the second petition prays for the transformation of us.

Pope Paul VI said the changes to the Eucharistic Prayer were the chief innovation in the liturgical form. Although the Roman Rite had used only one prayer for many centuries, the Eastern Rites used a variety of them during the same period. By expanding the number of Eucharistic Prayers and including an epiclesis in them, the council improved the ability of Catholics to enjoy the unity we share with other churches and the power of the Holy Spirit in our midst.

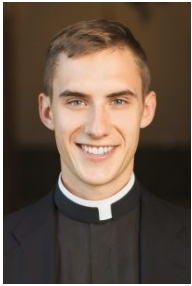

La Esquina del Vicario

Es la época del año para las primeras comuniones, por lo que es otro buen día para pensar en la Eucaristía. Recientemente estuve leyendo un buen libro llamado La teología del templo judío y el misterio de la Santa Cruz. (Aparte, realmente recomiendo leer sobre la fe. Es fácil dejar que nuestro conocimiento de nuestra fe, lo más importante en nuestras vidas, permanezca en un nivel infantil. ¡Combata esta tendencia leyendo!) Este libro en particular cubre mucho del terreno, pero una de las ideas clave en él, es la conexión entre la creación y la adoración. ¿Por qué Dios hizo el mundo? Podríamos descartar todo tipo de respuestas, pero la respuesta de la Biblia es "tener un espacio para la comunión". Es decir, Dios hizo el mundo como un lugar donde nosotros, sus criaturas, podíamos encontrarnos con él y adorarlo. Después de que Adán y Eva desobedecieron, salieron de su hogar en el Edén, el tabernáculo y luego el templo debían tomar el lugar del Jardín.

En el templo, el hombre podía acercarse a Dios en adoración. Los sacrificios del templo eran el nuevo medio de comunión. De hecho, la antigua palabra hebrea que significa "ofrecer sacrificio" (qorban, para todos los hebraístas) significa simplemente "acercarse". El templo existía para poner a Dios y a la humanidad en comunión. En la adoración en el templo, podemos participar en todo el propósito de la creación: la comunión y la adoración. Por supuesto, Jesús hace esto perfectamente, siendo Dios y hombre, en una sola persona. Y Jesús permanece con nosotros en la Eucaristía para permitirnos acercarnos a Dios a través del culto sacrificial de la Misa. La Eucaristía es la forma más perfecta de "comunión": nos permite no sólo "acercarnos" a Dios, sino también recibir y ser recibido por Él. Entonces, una forma de responder a la pregunta: "¿Por qué Dios hizo el mundo?" es simplemente "La Eucaristía". Dios creó el mundo y a nosotros para que pudiéramos entrar en una comunión amorosa con Él. La creación encuentra su cumplimiento en cada Misa.

Una forma de profundizar su aprecio por recibir la comunión es mediante la adoración eucarística, donde podemos "acercarnos" a Dios. Suceden tantas cosas durante la Misa que a veces podemos perder el foco en lo esencial. La adoración nos da tiempo para saborear el misterio de la Eucaristía. Cuando vamos a la adoración, nuestra participación en la Misa (¡la razón por la que Dios creó el mundo!) puede ser más plena, consciente y activa.
