Vicar's Corner

Fr. Edward Hoffmann

I'd like to thank everyone who came out to pray during the Forty Hours devotion and attended the Eucharistic Procession. It was a beautiful weekend of prayer. Some of you spent not one but several late night or very early morning hours in the Church before the Lord. I'm encouraged by your devotion!

I'll be here only two weeks more, and I've been thinking about what I've learned over the course of my three years here. Sometimes people ask me what the hardest part of being a priest is. My answer to that question has changed over the course of my three short years in ministry. I started off saying something like "visits to the hospital" - "hearing confessions" - "funerals" - you name it. Those things aren't easy for a new priest, but they're far from the greatest challenge I've faced. There's really only one good answer to that question. What's the greatest challenge I face as a priest? I am.

Shortly after my ordination, I was complaining to a very good friend of mine about my failures. I've had plenty of time for greater failures since then, so those particular ones seem small now, but then, they seemed pretty important. My friend chuckled and said, "well, I guess if God wanted someone competent, He would have called someone else." Ouch!

I quickly realized that my friend could have paid me no greater compliment. After all, the most important thing about us is not what we see in ourselves but what God sees - and has the power to create - in us. And God has given me a share, despite everything, in the High Priesthood of Jesus Christ, making me capable of doing what angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim - the Blessed Virgin herself! - cannot do: consecrating the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ as His priest.

I'm most grateful to all of you who have seen beyond my few virtues and many vices to who and what I really am, and have helped me grow, by faltering steps, in my identity as a priest of Jesus Christ. At one time or another you have all called me "Father," a title which only an omnipotent sense of humor could dream of bestowing on me. From the bottom of my heart, I thank you. ■

From Father Walling: Welcome, Father Nam Vu, S.V.D.!

Archbishop Schnurr has formally appointed Father Nam Vu, S.V.D. as parochial vicar for our C-6 Saint Stephen Family of Parishes. Fr. Nam was born in Vietnam, but was raised in Cincinnati, where he went to schools at Holy Family and Elder. He was ordained a priest in 2010 for the Society of the Divine Word (S.V.D. are the Latin initials), a missionary religious order whose members serve the Church in eighty-four countries worldwide. He is fluent in Spanish, having spent two years in Argentina, and most recently serving at Saint Patrick Parish in Fort Wayne, Indiana, where the Sunday Masses are in English, Spanish and Vietnamese. Fr. Vu is looking forward to sharing his priestly life and ministry with us, and I am excited to have him join us. His assignment begins July 1st.



From Father Walling: Sunday Evening Masses Upcoming!

After consulting with staffs and parish councils at Saint Aloysius and Saint Peter in Chains, I have decided to offer a **seven o'clock** Sunday evening Mass once a month on the first **Sunday of the month** on a trial basis for six months in order to gauge your response to and participation at Sunday Mass at that hour. The scheduled Mass will alternate between the two parishes (Saint Al's and Saint Pete's), but, due to previous commitments, on an uneven basis: **AT SAINT PETER IN CHAINS on July 7th, August 4th and November 3rd; AT SAINT ALOYSIUS on September 1st, October 6th and December 1st.** Liturgical ministers will be needed: greeters/ushers, servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of holy communion. Mass Moments

Mystery of Faith

When the priest introduces the Memorial Acclamation, he uses a brief statement: "The mystery of faith." In the first English translation of the post-Vatican II Mass, he said, "Let us proclaim the mystery of faith," but the revised translation keeps his statement as short as possible. It resembles other announcements during the Mass, such as those that conclude the readings ("The Word of the Lord" and "The Gospel of the Lord"), as well as those for distributing Communion ("The Body of Christ" and "The Blood of Christ.") In each case, the statement provokes a response.

These words were part of the consecration of the wine at every Mass before Vatican II. The priest would say, "This is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, the mystery of faith, which will be poured for you." Those words "the mystery of faith" were not part of the earliest tradition of the Eucharistic Prayer, but were added by the seventh century. They may have come into the words for the consecration of the chalice because deacons administered Communion from the chalice, and Paul wrote that deacons should hold fast to the mystery of the faith (1 Timothy 3:9).

Today it refers not so much to the consecration as to the total paschal mystery expressed in the memorial acclamation. The words were never assigned to the deacon, even though in some places this became the practice. In the first translation, the priest addressed the people at this point, but in the revision, he simply pronounces the words into the air. He keeps his mind and heart focused where they belong: not on the people right now, but on his prayer to the Father.

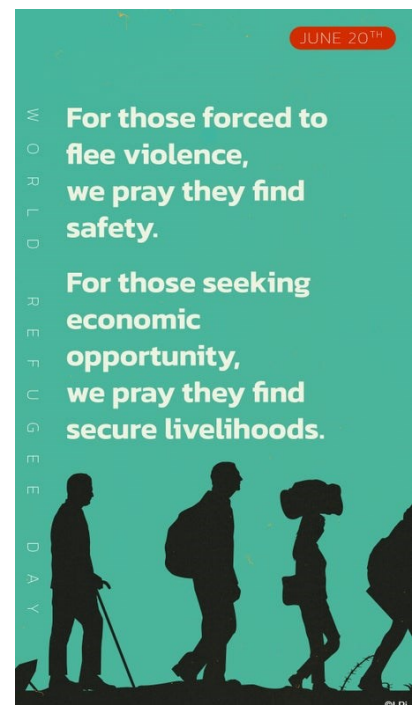


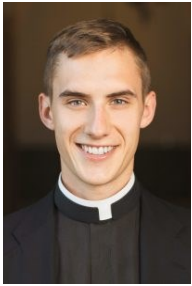

Poco después de mi ordenación, me quejaba con un muy buen amigo mío sobre mis fracasos. Desde entonces, he tenido mucho tiempo para mayores fracasos, por lo que aquellos en particular me parecen pequeños ahora, pero en aquel entonces, parecían bastante importantes. Mi amigo sonrió y dijo: "Bueno, supongo que si Dios hubiera querido a alguien competente, habría llamado a otra persona". ¡Ay!

Rápidamente me di cuenta de que mi amigo no podría haberme hecho un cumplido mayor. Después de todo, lo más importante de nosotros no es lo que vemos en nosotros mismos, sino lo que Dios ve -y tiene el poder de crear- en nosotros. Y Dios me ha dado una parte, a pesar de todo, en el Sumo Sacerdicio de Jesucristo, haciéndome capaz de hacer lo que los ángeles y arcángeles, querubines y serafines - ¡la Santísima Virgen misma! - no pueden hacer: consagrar el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor Jesucristo como Su sacerdote.
