

From Father Walling: Welcome, Father Nam Vu, S.V.D.!

Archbishop Schnurr has formally appointed Father Nam Vu, S.V.D. as parochial vicar for our C-6 Saint Stephen Family of Parishes. Fr. Nam was born in Vietnam, but was raised in Cincinnati, where he went to school at Holy Family and Elder. He was ordained a priest in 2010 for the Society of the Divine Word (S.V.D. are the Latin initials), a missionary religious order whose members serve the Church in eighty-four countries worldwide. He is fluent in Spanish, having spent two years in Argentina, and most recently serving at Saint Patrick Parish in Fort Wayne, Indiana, where the Sunday Masses are in English, Spanish and Vietnamese. Fr. Vu is looking forward to sharing his priestly life and ministry with us, and I am excited to have him join us. His assignment began **July 1st**.



7th Annual Festival of Faiths

On **Sunday, August 25**, the 7th annual Cincinnati Festival of Faiths will be held at the Cintas Center on XU's campus from 12:00 – 5:00 p.m. EquaSion, one of Cincinnati's preeminent interfaith organizations, hosts this powerful event which is the city's largest interfaith celebration. It's a gathering of 34 faith traditions and 13 world religions from the Greater Cincinnati area. It's an exhibition with great food and entertainment, and admission is free. Retrouvaille Program for Struggling Marriages

The Retrouvaille program is designed to help save marriages by offering hope and healing to married couples who are struggling with serious difficulties. It is structured in three phases, starting with a weekend led by married couples and a priest chaplain. The techniques learned at the weekend are further developed during the second phase, which is a series of six successive Saturdays. The final phase includes ongoing monthly small group gatherings, intended to provide casual and supportive interaction with other couples who have attended the Retrouvaille program. Project Rachel

A ministry of the archdiocese that serves anyone who has experienced the loss of a child due to abortion. Mass Moments

Sign of Peace

At the Sign of Peace, worshipers are invited to show their peace and love before receiving the Eucharist, which accomplishes their unity most perfectly. The nature of the sign is to be determined by the culture of the people who express it. In the United States, the bishops let local communities determine the actions and words. We have no set formula or gesture for extending this sign. Most often worshipers will shake hands and say, "Peace be with you." But you may also see them kiss or embrace, wave or flash a two-fingered Sign of Peace. Although today it would seem cold to omit the Sign of Peace, it is optional.

Introduced in the 1960s to a bashful Church unaccustomed to speaking to one another at worship, it broke the silent mood before Communion. Now it has become a welcome expression of unity among those preparing for Communion together in Christ.

The invitation to extend the Sign of Peace comes from the deacon. The deacon directs posture, gesture, and action in the liturgy. He tells us when to stand or sit, when to leave and when to show peace.

The placement of the Sign of Peace still confuses some who think it comes too late to say hello and too early to say goodbye. However, the purpose of the sign is not to extend a greeting. It is to express our love; it foreshadows our Communion. It's like an all-for-one huddle before the team charges into play.

Team members should have said hello to one other long before. In fact, some communities take a few moments before Mass begins precisely to encourage worshipers to greet those near them. Such a greeting allows people to feel at home, and it can also be shared by catechumens who will be dismissed after the homily. The Sign of Peace has a purpose deeper than a greeting—it expresses the unity of those baptized in Christ.

When extending the Sign of Peace, attentive worshipers resist turning it into a break. This is not the time to congratulate someone on their anniversary, to set up an appointment, or to exchange messages with the servers. It is the time to express peace and love.





La Recepción de la Sagrada Comunión en la Misa (Información tomada del website de la USCCB)

La asamblea litúrgica de los bautizados que vienen a reunirse para la celebración de la Eucaristía es un testigo, una manifestación, de la iglesia peregrina. Cuando nos movemos en procesión, particularmente, en la procesión para recibir el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo en la Comunión, somos un signo, un símbolo de esa Iglesia peregrina "en camino."

La Procesión de la Comunión es una acción del Cuerpo de Cristo. Los miembros de la comunidad, respondiendo a la invitación del mismo Cristo por medio del Sacerdote que actúa "en la Persona de Cristo" 1 (Bienaventurados aquéllos que han sido llamados a la cena del Señor) 2, donde se dará el compartir el alimento sagrado, recibido en el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo, señal y fuente de unidad. De hecho, cada vez que nos disponemos para recibir el cuerpo y la sangre del Señor, nos unimos a los innumerables rangos de todos los bautizados que han muerto antes que nosotros, nuestros seres queridos, los santos canonizados y no canonizados a lo largo de los siglos, quienes en algún momento de la historia formaron parte de este gran multitud de creyentes.

Esta acción del cuerpo de Cristo, la Iglesia reunida para la Eucaristía, se manifiesta y se apoya en el Himno de la Comunión, un himno de alabanza a Cristo cantado al unísono por las voces de quienes creen en Él y comparten Su vida. La Institución General del Misal Romano toma muy en serio este himno, estableciendo que debe empezar en el momento de la Comunión del sacerdote y que debe extenderse hasta que la última persona haya comulgado.
