Mass Moments

Under My Roof

After the priest invites the people to receive Communion, they express their unworthiness for it. The first English translation had the people say, "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you," but the revised translation puts it this way: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof." The revision expresses more closely the words that have always been there in Latin. The first translation recognized the difficulty of the metaphor, but the revised Missal restores it in hopes that it will provoke meditation and prayer.

Why "under my roof"? The words, of course, come from the story of Jesus's healing the servant of the centurion (Matthew 8:8; Luke 7:6). In Matthew's account, the centurion himself comes to Jesus, but in Luke's version, he sends representatives. In either case, he doesn't feel right having Jesus come to his home, and he has complete trust in Jesus's power over sickness and evil. And, perhaps, he just wants to avoid inconveniencing the master. His statement is one of faith, trust, and respect. So Jesus works the miracle.

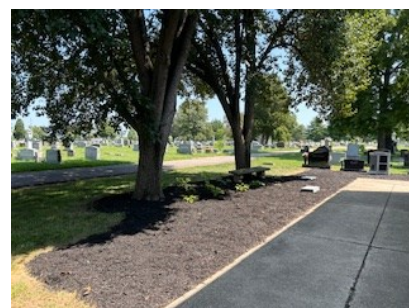
The invitation to Communion should call this story to mind. Some people may mistakenly think that the new words refer to the roof of the mouth. But its intent is to quote the centurion. We should have the same attitude: faith, trust, and respect.

Jesus, unfailingly, in spite of our unworthiness, still draws us to his table. We are not praying for the physical healing of our servant; we are praying for the spiritual healing of our soul. We can be confident that our prayer will be answered as we leave our place, go to the minister, and present ourselves for Communion.

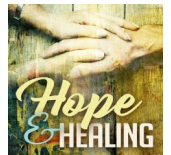

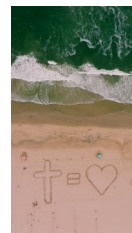

La Recepción de la Sagrada Comunión en la Misa (Información tomada del website de la USCCB)

La Institución General solicita a la Conferencia Episcopal de cada país que determine la postura corporal de la Comunión y el acto de reverencia que se ha de realizar por cada persona en el momento de recibirla. En los Estados Unidos, los obispos han decidido que "[l]a norma... es que los fieles reciban la Sagrada Comunión de pie, a no ser que alguno de los fieles desee recibir la Comunión de rodillas" y que se haga una venia como signo de reverencia por parte de aquellas personas que la reciben (n. 160). Esta norma se basa en una Instrucción de la Santa Sede sobre la Eucaristía: "En la distribución de la sagrada Comunión se debe recordar que 'los ministros sagrados no pueden negar los sacramentos a quienes los pidan de modo oportuno, estén bien dispuestos y no les sea prohibido por el derecho recibirlos' (Código de Derecho Canónico, c. 843 § 1; cf. c. 915). Por consiguiente, cualquier bautizado católico, a quien el derecho no se lo prohíba, debe ser admitido a la sagrada Comunión. Así pues, no es lícito negar la sagrada Comunión a un fiel, por ejemplo, sólo por el hecho de querer recibir la Eucaristía arrodillado o de pie" (Redemptionis Sacramentum, n. 91).



Quienes reciben la Comunión pueden hacerlo tanto en la mano como en la lengua; sin embargo, la decisión final está en la persona que la recibe, no en la persona que la distribuye. Si la Comunión se recibe en la mano, las manos deben estar completamente limpias. Si uno es diestro, la mano izquierda debe descansar sobre la mano derecha. La hostia será luego depositada sobre la palma de la mano izquierda y luego tomada por la mano derecha hasta llevarla a la boca. Si una persona es zurda, se hará del modo contrario. Es inapropiado tomarla con los dedos directamente de la mano de la persona que la distribuye.

La persona que distribuye la Comunión dice a cada persona que se aproxima y de manera que se oiga, "El Cuerpo de Cristo". Esta fórmula no debe ser alterada ya que es una proclamación que invita a una respuesta de fe de parte de la persona que la recibe. El comulgante debe responder de manera audible "Amén", indicando, por su respuesta, su creencia de que este pequeño pedazo de pan y el vino de este cáliz son en realidad el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo, el Señor.
