Mass Moments

Purifying Vessels

The vessels used for the distribution of Communion at Mass are to be purified. Purification involves gathering and consuming the remaining fragments and droplets of the Body and Blood of Christ.

The purification may take place immediately after Communion or after the entire Mass is concluded. The action may be done in any one of three locations. If the vessels are purified after Mass, they go to the sacristy. If they are purified during Mass, it happens either at the credence table or at the altar. If the ministers purify the vessels at the altar, they should stand at the side of the altar, so the action does not resemble the central parts of the Mass.

The responsibility for purifying the vessels falls to a priest, a deacon, or an instituted acolyte. An instituted acolyte is usually a man preparing for ordination who assumes this duty along with others pertaining to the distribution of Communion.

The vessels may be purified with water or with water and wine. In the past, the priest always poured a little wine into the chalice after Communion to dilute what remained of the precious Blood. Today it is more common to use only water. To purify vessels, the minister takes care of any fragments remaining on the corporal. He uses a purificator to wipe the vessels that held the Body of Christ, sweeping any remaining fragments into the chalice. If he is using wine, he adds a small amount. He then pours some water into the chalice to collect the elements gathered there, and he swallows the contents while saying a prayer.

After Mass, once all the vessels have been properly purified, someone should wash the vessels with soap and water.

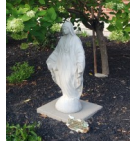
Children's Liturgy of the Word- All Are Welcome!

New Antiphon's During Mass

Fr. Walling has requested a change in the Antiphons used during Mass. What are antiphons? The word antiphon comes from the way in which this song is put into practice, namely sung alternately by two choirs, traditionally a verse or phrase from a psalm that was key to a liturgical meaning for a given celebration. Within the liturgy these antiphons are the Introit or Entrance Antiphon, and the Communion Antiphon. These are typically intended to accompany ritual processions during the liturgy. Primarily, these texts are taken verbatim from a specific psalm or canticle and in addition, from the gospels, epistles or other scriptural passages.

Did you notice the "Children's Mass Bags?"

Back in the vestibule we placed several Children's Mass bags. These bags are for children (ages 1 to 4) to borrow during Mass. The bags are filled with enriching activities to support our young families as they take part in the Mass each Sunday. We also hope it becomes a fun tradition for little ones to look forward to when they come to Mass. Grab one to take to your pew when you arrive and return it before you leave. Enjoy!

- 3 Extiende tu mano izquierda (si eres diestro) o derecha (si eres zurdo) **con la palma hacia arriba**.
- 4 Coloca tu otra mano debajo. Decía san Juan Crisóstomo que eso era como **prepararle un trono al Señor**.
- 5 Te pondrán la Hostia sobre la palma. **No te adelantes a intentar tomarla** usando los dedos como pinzas.
- 6 Toma la Hostia con tus dedos índice y pulgar de la mano que está debajo, pon la otra mano bajo tu barbilla, como si fuera un platillo, para evitar que cualquier partícula caiga al suelo. **Y consume la Hostia allí mismo, antes de volver a tu lugar.**
- 7 Verifica que en la palma de tu mano y en tus dedos no hayan quedado partículas de la Hostia. Si las hay, consúmelas. **Por ningún motivo te sacudas las manos como si te quitaras polvo.**

Recuerda que aún el más mínimo fragmento **es el Cuerpo de Cristo**. Trátalo con toda reverencia y respeto.
