December 9: Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary - Holy Day of Obligation

The Vatican recently clarified that Catholics in the United States are required to attend Mass on holy days of obligation, even when these days are transferred to a Saturday or Monday. This directive corrects a longstanding practice in the U.S. Church where the obligation was traditionally lifted if a holy day was adjacent to a Sunday. This year, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (our national patronal feast day) is transferred from Sunday, to **Monday, Dec 9**, and is a holy day of obligation.

Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo (Solemnidad) Daniel 7, 13-14; Salmo 92; Apocalipsis 1, 5-8; Juan 18, 33-37

La Parroquia Santa Julia Billiart es una comunidad urbana Católica-Romana, situada en la ciudad de Hamilton, Ohio. Santa Julia acoge la diversidad de todos aquellos que buscan formar parte del cuerpo de Cristo. Nos congregamos para alabar a nuestro Señor y celebrar Su misericordia divina. Aspiramos a construir el Reino de Dios a través de la oración, el servicio social, la educación y la confraternidad.

Visita a los Enfermos

Quienes visitan a los enfermos deben ayudarlos a orar, compartiendo con ellos la palabra de Dios proclamada en la asamblea de la que los ha separado su enfermedad. (Atención pastoral a los enfermos: Ritos de la unción y el viático, 46)

Cuando un miembro de nuestra iglesia cae enfermo, nuestros pensamientos se dirigen a menudo al sacerdote. Sólo él puede administrar el sacramento de los enfermos con óleo bendito. Sólo él concede el perdón en el sacramento de la Penitencia.

Pero cualquiera puede visitar a los enfermos. ¡Incluso tú! Probablemente ya lo hagas, pero tal vez no te des cuenta de que puedes actuar como ministro de la Iglesia mientras estás allí.

Todas las oraciones oficiales de la Iglesia por los enfermos provienen de un libro llamado Atención pastoral a los enfermos: Ritos de la unción y el viático. Tiene capítulos que describen cómo unge el sacerdote. Pero comienza con un capítulo sobre las visitas a los enfermos. Un sacerdote puede visitar a los enfermos, pero también puede hacerlo cualquier laico.

La liturgia es muy sencilla. El ministro puede invitar a todos a guardar silencio. Luego, alguien lee un pasaje de la Biblia. Puede elegir Hechos 3:1-10 o Mateo 8:14-17, o una de las Escrituras del domingo, o cualquier otro pasaje de importancia para el hogar. Un Salmo responsorial, como el 102 o el 27, sigue a esta proclamación. El ministro puede dar una explicación de las lecturas y aplicarlas a las necesidades de los enfermos y los cuidadores. Todos rezan el Padrenuestro. El ministro concluye con una oración y bendición, tal vez trazando la Señal de la Cruz en la frente de la persona enferma.

De estas maneras, puede llevar la liturgia de la Iglesia a quienes están separados de la asamblea de creyentes.

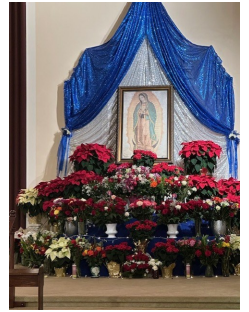
