





What's Happening at Badin...

- Catholic Schools Week begins Monday, Jan. 27, with an all-school Mass at Badin. Badin students will also participate in major Archdiocesan celebratory Masses in Cincinnati and Dayton. The final Kairos Senior Retreat of the school year is also on the calendar at the Bergamo Center in Beavercreek. While the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Cincinnati is just the 51st largest Catholic diocese in the country, it has the fifth-largest Catholic school system in terms of enrollment, with more than 41,000 students in 105 Catholic primary and secondary schools. Badin is proud to be a part of this excellence in education!
- Badin High School is excited to welcome the incoming Class of 2029! Students will have the opportunity to register for the class on Friday, Jan. 31, from 3 to 6 p.m. or on Saturday, Feb. 1, from 9 a.m. to noon. An evening scheduling event for all students who register is set for Tuesday, Feb. 4. For more details on the updated information, check the Badin website at BadinHS.org or contact Mrs. Natalie Agnew '14 in the Admissions Office at (513) 869-4498 or NAgnew@BadinHS.org. Badin was happy to host 252 8th grade Shadow Students in the fall, 96 families at various Ramformation Nights, and 210 families at Open House, according to Mrs. Agnew. That led to 237 students taking the High School Placement Test at Badin and more than 275 applications. We're looking forward to another great class in the Badin Ramily!
- Fifteen Badin students were involved in the annual Hamilton Civics Day program in December. This included an opportunity to shadow their government job, discuss potential recommendations, and wrap it up with a meeting and luncheon on Dec. 5 at the Fitton Center. Junior Connor Wood (Queen of Peace) was the student mayor, junior Lexi Brecht (Sacred Heart) was the school board president, junior Elyse Weinheimer • (St. John Dry Ridge) was the municipal court judge, and junior Kathleen Stratman (St. Maximilian Kolbe) was the fire chief. In addition, Mrs. Beth Enderle, who teaches junior Religion at Badin, was recognized for her excellence with a special Civics Day proclamation. Other BHS student participants included senior Aydyn Yang-Smith (St. Ann) and juniors Jack Blanton (St. Ann), Jake Cox (Cincinnati Hills Christian Academy), Colin Eilerman (St. Peter in Chains), Braelyn Even (Sacred Heart), Connor Hartford (Queen of Peace), Olivia Klefeker (Corpus Christi), Emily Lam (Sacred Heart), John Loeffler (Sacred Heart), Camila Oliva (St. Julie Billiart) and Max Snellgrove (Queen of Peace). Social Studies teacher Mr. Jordan Seitz is Badin's Civics Day moderator.
- Congratulations to senior Gracie Cosgrove (Sacred Heart), who became just the 9th Badin High girls basketball player to eclipse the 1,000 point mark on Saturday, Dec. 21. Cosgrove scored 19 points in a 60-23 win over Talawanda at the Rams' Mulcahey Gym. It was her 9th point — a free throw in the second quarter — that was the 1,000th point. Gracie is taking aim at the top spot: Emma Broermann '19, who is the all-time leading scorer in Badin hoop history (girls or boys) with 1,291 points.

- Others in four figures solely at Badin include Kim Kraft Richter '90, 1,228; Kara Gerbus McGaughey '12, 1,178; Lizzy Sunderhaus '08, 1,081; and Jada Pohlen '22, 1,001. Three other girls passed the 1,000 point mark while playing for Badin, but were transfers who had scored varsity points at other high schools — Jill DeFosse Angst '95, 1,135; Mahya Lindesmith '22, 1,085; and Amber Bunce Agee '98, 1,046.
- Junior Braelyn Even (Sacred Heart) broke into the Top 10 in scoring this season and is headed for 1,000, as she and Gracie Cosgrove (Sacred Heart) now hold the record for points scored among a twosome while playing for Badin, displacing the Mahya Lindesmith/Jada Pohlen combination from 2022. Cosgrove also has the all-time single-game scoring mark in Badin basketball annals, a 48-point outing as a sophomore in January 2023. The outstanding shooter tied the Ohio girls prep record for 3-point field goals in a game that night as well, with 14.
- Four seniors put together a memorable Christmas party at the Boys and Girls Club of Hamilton for their Senior Service project. Seniors Xander Arnold (St. Peter in Chains), Kade Bowling (St. Peter in Chains), Gracie McGill (Sacred Heart) and Ruby Zboril (St. Joseph) hosted an outstanding event at the East Club, which included a turn by Kade Bowling as Santa Claus and his father, Ry, as an Elf!
- Congratulations to Badin senior Jordan Von Bargen (Sacred Heart) who was recognized through the Purple Monkey Project with a Reagan Vanoss Legacy Scholarship from the Fairfield Community Foundation. The Purple Monkey Project highlights service with children in honor of the late Reagan Vanoss, a lovely child who adored her purple monkey.

January 24, 2025 Memorial of St. Francis de Sales Principal Patron of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In his October 2004 apostolic letter *Mane Nobiscum Domine*, Pope St. John Paul II wrote: "[B]y our mutual love and, in particular, by our concern for those in need we will be recognized as true followers of Christ (cf. Jn. 13:35; Mt. 25:31-46). This will be the criterion by which the authenticity of our Eucharistic celebrations is judged" (28). With these words, the Holy Father underscored the divine connection between the Body and Blood of Christ that we freely receive and what we do as a result.

Like two sides of the same coin, there is an inseparable relationship for our path to salvation between God's gift of the Eucharist and our willingness to selflessly give of ourselves to others. To believe in a God that is love is also to assent that "each of us is truly called, together with Jesus, to be bread broken for the life of the world," especially for the most vulnerable among us (Benedict XVI, Sacramentum Caritatis, 88).

The Catholic Church in the United States has embarked upon the third and final stage of our Eucharistic Revival: the Year of Mission. After having so joyfully and publicly welcomed the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage to the archdiocese last year, we now remind ourselves of the mission to be Christ for others. The world needs us to shine as examples of God's love and compassion. The unborn, mothers in need, immigrants, homeless, and so many other vulnerable people long for us to see them with the eyes of Jesus, who has a special place for the poor in His heart.

In the context of Beacons of Light, the Eucharistic Revival's Year of Mission is well-expressed through the Love in Action principle. This principle encompasses our parish ministries of charity and social justice that organize our time, treasure and talents to respect human life from conception until natural death, serve those in need, welcome migrants, advocate for a more just and peaceful world, promote solidarity through global missions, create spaces of belonging for those with disabilities and care for God's creation.

The Eucharist is also a source of unity. In these relentlessly polarized times, our Love in Action ministries present a unique and prophetic witness to how we as Catholics overcome ideological, racial and social differences to advance the life and dignity of everyone. Likewise, the Eucharistic Revival Year of Mission is a welcomed opportunity for us to remind ourselves and

our communities of how powerfully this Sacrament motivates us to see all people as beloved members of one human family.

It is also fitting that the universal Church is celebrating the Jubilee Year 2025 with the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Motivated by the Eucharist to put our love into action in a divided and violent world, we all need a limitless source of hope. In his Bull of Indiction for the Jubilee, Pope Francis assures us that our Christian faith offers us in all circumstances hope in God, a hope that does not fade. "May it help us to recover the confident trust that we require," the Holy Father prays, "in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation" (Spes Non Confundit, 25).

Therefore, for this Eucharistic Revival Year of Mission during the Jubilee Year of Hope, I encourage all Families of Parishes, schools and other Catholic entities in the archdiocese to put a special emphasis on advancing Love in Action over the next five months. More details regarding ways to do this are available through the archdiocesan Office of Catholic Social Action at https://catholicaoc.org/yearofmission. We will conclude the Eucharistic Revival's Year of Mission with a Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains on the Feast of the Ascension, Sunday, June 1, 2025, to which all of you are invited.

Thank you for all you do to be ever transformed by the Body of Christ to put God's love into action. By doing so, you are a pilgrim of hope for the local Church and all the world.



Mis estimados hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

En su carta apostólica de octubre de 2004 *Mane Nobiscum Domine*, el Papa San Juan Pablo II escribió: "por el amor mutuo y, en particular, por la atención a los necesitados se nos reconocerá como verdaderos discípulos de Cristo (cf. Jn. 13:35; Mt. 25:31-46). En base a este criterio se comprobará la autenticidad de nuestras celebraciones eucarísticas" (28). Con estas palabras, el Santo Padre subrayó la conexión divina entre el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo que recibimos gratuitamente y lo que hacemos como resultado.

Como dos caras de una misma moneda, existe una relación inseparable para nuestro camino hacia la salvación entre el don de Dios de la Eucaristía y nuestra voluntad de entregarnos desinteresadamente a los demás. Creer en un Dios que es amor es también aceptar que "la Eucaristía impulsa a todo el que cree en Él a hacerse 'pan partido' para los demás", especialmente para los más vulnerables entre nosotros (Benedicto XVI, Sacramentum Caritatis, 88).

La Iglesia católica en los Estados Unidos se ha embarcado en la tercera y última etapa de nuestro Avivamiento Eucarístico: el Año de la Misión. Después de haber acogido públicamente y con tanta alegría a la Peregrinación Eucarística Nacional cuando pasó por la arquidiócesis el año pasado, ahora recordamos la misión de ser Cristo para los demás. El mundo necesita que brillemos como ejemplos del amor y la compasión de Dios. En estos tiempos tan polarizados, nuestros ministerios de Amor en Acción presentan un testimonio único y profético de cómo nosotros, como católicos, superamos las diferencias ideológicas, raciales y sociales para promover la vida y la dignidad de todos. De la misma manera, el Año de la Misión del Avivamiento Eucarístico es una

buena oportunidad para que recordemos a nosotros mismos y a nuestras comunidades cuán poderosamente este Sacramento nos motiva a ver a todas las personas como miembros amados de una sola familia humana.

También es oportuno que la Iglesia universal celebre el Año Jubilar 2025 con el tema Peregrinos de la Esperanza. Motivados por la Eucaristía a poner nuestro amor en acción en un mundo dividido y violento, todos necesitamos una fuente ilimitada de esperanza. En su Bula de convocación del Jubileo, el Papa Francisco nos asegura que nuestra fe cristiana nos ofrece en toda circunstancia esperanza en Dios, una esperanza que no se desvanece. El Santo Padre reza: "Que nos ayude también a recuperar la confianza necesaria —tanto en la Iglesia como en la sociedad—en los vínculos interpersonales, en las relaciones internacionales, en la promoción de la dignidad de toda persona y en el respeto de la creación" (Spes Non Confundit, 25).

Por lo tanto, para este Año de la Misión del Avivamiento Eucarístico durante el Año Jubilar de la Esperanza, animo a todas las Familias de Parroquias, escuelas y otras entidades católicas de la arquidiócesis a poner un énfasis especial en promover el Amor en Acción durante los próximos cinco meses.
