From Fr. Walling: Missionary Cooperation Plan: Asking for Your Support

As part of the Missionary Cooperation Plan sponsored by our Archdiocese of Cincinnati, a representative from the Diocese of Goaso in Ghana, West Africa will be speaking at each of the Sunday Masses in our St. Stephen Family over the next several weeks, asking for our prayers and our financial support. In his letter, the Bishop of Goaso, Most Rev. Peter K. Atuahene, informs us that his location is in an especially poor and rural part of Ghana, where most people are engaged in subsistence farming, and where there is considerable need for providing safe water, health services, schools and other basic amenities. He closes his letter in this way: "I am therefore appealing to your generosity to help your brothers and sisters in a far-distant country. God's blessings on you!" A second collection will be taken up in response to this appeal as it is given at the various Masses. Stay tuned. Thanks.

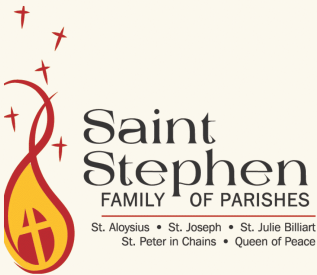

Gospel Meditation - Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

June 22, 2025: The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ; Luke 9:11-17

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, “The Eucharist is not a noun. It’s a verb.” In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn’t simply Jesus’ bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let’s consider each one.

He takes: Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God’s hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

He blesses: Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He breaks: Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He gives: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.

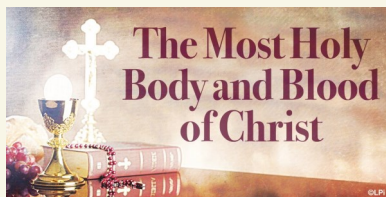

La Parroquia Santa Julia Billiart es una comunidad urbana Católica-Romana, situada en la ciudad de Hamilton, Ohio. Santa Julia acoge la diversidad de todos aquellos que buscan formar parte del cuerpo de Cristo. Nos congregamos para alabar a nuestro Señor y celebrar Su misericordia divina. Aspiramos a construir el Reino de Dios a través de la oración, el servicio social, la educación y la confraternidad.

El Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo

Hoy celebramos una gran fiesta para todos los cristianos: el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. “El Corpus”, como popularmente le llamamos, es la celebración de ese gran acontecimiento que brota desde el más grande Amor para quedarse en alimento y presencia para todos los hombres.

La Eucaristía nace del amor de Cristo y se vuelve fundamento del amor entre los fieles reunidos en torno al alimento donado por Jesús, el pan que es su Cuerpo, el vino que es su Sangre. La Eucaristía responde a los más profundos anhelos y necesidades del hombre: su necesidad de alimento, su sed de amor, y su realización en la relación con los demás.

La Eucaristía sostiene toda la vida de la comunidad creyente. Mientras hacemos presente el “amor hasta el extremo” por el que Jesús ofreció su vida en la cruz (pasado), nos comprometemos a formar un sólo cuerpo animado por la fe y la caridad solidaria (presente), “mientras esperamos su venida gloriosa” (futuro).

En torno a la mesa del altar se renueva el sacrificio de Jesús y lo hace presente en medio de la asamblea. La comunión, común-unió, con Jesús nos une en un solo cuerpo a todos los participantes.

No podemos comulgar con Jesús y estar divididos entre los hermanos. La gran señal de los primeros cristianos era su reunión dominical para “alimentarse” de la Palabra y del Cuerpo del Señor, para expresar su solidaridad con los demás en la “koinonía” que consistía en compartir los bienes. Así como el pan se parte y se comparte, el verdadero cristiano parte y comparte lo que es y lo que tiene.

Pero al mismo tiempo la Eucaristía o Fracción del Pan, tiene el sentido fuerte de esperanza. La mesa común es signo no sólo de la mesa en la que participaremos todos en el cielo, sino también de esa mesa común que queremos formar para ofrecer a todos los hombres sin distinción de raza, lengua o condición humana.

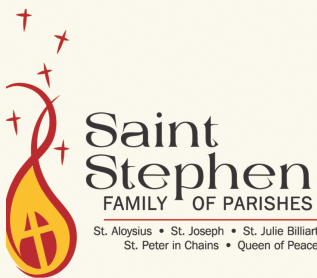

Conoce y Ejerce tus Derechos en caso de detención migratoria

Conoce tus derechos en tu casa, lugar de trabajo o en la calle.

Si las autoridades migratorias llegan a tu casa:

- » Mantén la calma y no abras la puerta.
- » No huyas.
- » No reveles tu situación migratoria.
- » Pide la orden judicial de arresto y/o resgistro. Si la tienen, pide que la muestren por la ventana y revisa que tenga tu nombre, dirección y la firma del juez.
- » Si no tienen una orden judicial, puedes negarles el acceso.
- » *Recuerda que una orden administrativa del ICE (forma I-200, I-205) no les da autorización para entrar a tu casa.

Si las autoridades te detienen:

- » Guarda silencio.
- » Pide hablar con el Consulado y no reveles tu situación migratoria.
- » Comunícate con tu abogado.
- » No firmes nada que no entiendas.
- » Averigua qué agencia te arrestó (sheriff, departamento de policía local, ICE, patrulla fronteriza, etc.).
- » Solicita un intérprete y una fianza.
- » No mientas y no muestres documentos falsos.

Elabora un plan familiar

- » Asegúrate de tener una carta poder que especifique a la persona encargada del cuidado de tus hijos/hijos en caso de emergencia.
- » Cerciórate de que todas las personas que integran tu familia tengan sus documentos mexicanos y estadounidenses.
- » No olvides contar con copias físicas y digitales de estos documentos.*
