

As part of the Missionary Cooperation Plan sponsored by our Archdiocese of Cincinnati, a representative from the Diocese of Goaso in Ghana, West Africa will be speaking at each of the Sunday Masses in our St. Stephen Family over the next several weeks, asking for our prayers and our financial support. In his letter, the Bishop of Goaso, Most Rev. Peter K. Atuahene, informs us that his location is in an especially poor and rural part of Ghana, where most people are engaged in subsistence farming, and where there is considerable need for providing safe water, health services, schools and other basic amenities. He closes his letter in this way: "I am therefore appealing to your generosity to help your brothers and sisters in a far-distant country. God's blessings on you!" Candy Alert!!


Until July 7, Butler County Right to Life's annual pro-life fair booth is requesting donations of bags of wrapped candy (like you

Advocacy for Catholic Relief Services

Countless lives are at risk. The Senate is currently considering a package of cuts to international assistance. This package proposes cancelling funding, approved by both republicans and democrats in March, for programming focused on supporting pregnant mothers and their children, providing emergency food, preventing infectious diseases and ensuring children, families and communities can move out of poverty over the long-term.

At this very same moment, Congress is also assessing support for lifesaving aid in the fiscal year 2026 federal budget. Approving this new package of cuts would signal approval for shrinking or eliminating funding for international poverty-reducing programs in future budgets.

What's Happening at Badin...

THINK. ACHIEVE. SERVE. LEAD.

- Andrew Keck (St. Ann) earned the Stephen T. Badin graduation medal for the Class of 2025 at the graduation exercises at St. Susanna Catholic Church in Mason on Friday, May 30. The Stephen T. Badin medal recognizes the most outstanding member of the class "by every measure" as voted on by faculty, staff and classmates. Keck plans to attend the University of Dayton and major in Biology.
- **Dr. Ben Paulus**, senior Religion teacher, gave the keynote speech to what was the 59th graduating class in the history of Badin High School. A total of 160 students graduated. They will attend 46 schools in 10 states, including Alabama, Colorado and Mississippi. Miami University (37 students) and the University of Cincinnati (25 students) led the way, with seven students each headed to Mount St. Joseph University and Ohio State University. The 160 students in the graduating class represented the largest since 163 students graduated in 2007.
- Other graduation medal winners included Josie Halverson (St. Peter in Chains), the Archbishop Leibold medal for contributions to the School and Community; Eli Wesner (St. Maximilian Kolbe), the Archbishop Alter medal for contributions to Faith Life; and Annika Patel (Bethany), the Archbidshop McNicholas medal as the class valedictorian. Annika will attend the University of Maryland in College Park, Josie is headed to Loyola University of Chicago, and Eli will attend Ohio State University.
- More than 1,000 people were on hand for the June 6th dedication of the new Matandy SportsPlex, the \$15 million on-campus stadium behind the high school on New London Road in Hamilton. The tremendous project including the Lanni Family Stadium at Coach Terry Malone Field includes the football/soccer stadium; an all-weather track; two sets of bleachers seating some 2,400 fans; an Alumni Room; separate lockerrooms for football, boys soccer and girls soccer; concessions and ticketing on both sides of the stadium; and a separate all-turf practice field. Numerous VIPs were on hand for the opening program, which concluded with a blessing and dedication from Badin chaplain Father Ed Pratt. A girl/boy soccer twin bill officially opens the stadium for play on Aug. 15.
- Senior Maren Bultman (St. Julie Billiart) will be the Executive President of Badin Student Council for the 2025-26 school year. Other members of the Executive Board include Vice President Lexi Brecht (Sacred Heart), Secretary Camila Olivia (St. Julie Billiart), and Treasurer John Loeffler (Sacred Heart). Senior class officers are President Max Snellgrove (Queen of Peace), Vice President Brooklyn Frech (St. Julie Billiart) and Secretary/Treasurer Grace Goldberg (Sacred Heart).
- The Badin Girls Flag Football team won the inaugural state championship, going 3-0 at Paul Brown Tiger Stadium on May 18 in Massillon to grab the title. The girls, under the direction of co-head coaches Mike Sebastian and Christy Even, finished with a 13-3 record.

- They knocked off Willoughby South, 40-16, in the finals of the eight-team championship tournament, with four teams sponsored by the Cincinnati Bengals and four by the Cleveland Browns. They also beat Burton Berkshire and Cincinnati Mount Notre Dame on the way to the finals in what is an exciting and fast-paced 5-on-5 game. Seniors on the team included Michelle Garcia (Sacred Heart), Abby Mathews (Sacred Heart), Ashley Pate (St. John West Chester), Ella Pfirman (St. Peter in Chains), Claire Ressler (Sacred Heart) and Brooke Sebastian (Harrison Junior). Other members of the 18-player roster who saw notable playing time included junior Lexi Brecht (Sacred Heart), sophomore Bella Heile (St. Susanna), and freshmen Hanna Rowe (Our Lady of Visitation) and Maddie Treadway (St. Peter in Chains).
- Major year-end faith and service awards included the Pope John XXIII Liturgy Award, which went to senior Kort Riegert (St. Joseph) and Sam VonHagen (St. Joseph); the Sister Dorothy Stang Award for Service to senior Maguire Smith (Queen of Peace); and the Spirit of St. Julie Billiart Award for faith to senior **Phoebe Krause** (St. Susanna). In addition, the Badin Service Learning Book Award went to junior Olivia Klefeker, and the Sisters of Notre Dame Academic Excellence Award went to junior Kendyl Haire. Two faculty awards were also presented — the Badin Cuvilly Award to Mrs. Christina Dennler, and the Spirit of Dorothy Stang Award to Ms. Jackie Noelker.
- Substantive book awards to juniors were presented on Tuesday evening, May 20. Recipients included Maddie Berry (Sacred Heart), the Brown University Book Award for English; Lexi Brecht (Sacred Heart), the Tulane University Book Award for Excellence; Maren Bultman (St. Julie Billiart), the Bowdoin College Book Award for Innovative Thinking; Matthew Lees (Sacred Heart), the University of Louisville Book Award for Intellectual Curiosity; Max Snellgrove (Queen of Peace), the University of Rochester Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony Award for Leadership; Josie Veite (Beautiful Savior), the St. Lawrence University Book Award for Science; and Connor Wood (Queen of Peace), the Bausch & Lomb Award for Science.
- The Boys Baseball team had another outstanding season, reaching the Final Four for the fourth time in five years before bowing to Newark Licking Valley, 2-1 in nine innings in the D-III state semifinals at Canal Park in Akron. Starting with a four-game swing in Florida over Spring Break, the Rams went 25-7 and won the GCL Coed Division title for the 8th straight season. When the Rams run-ruled Monroe, 12-2, in the regional semifinals, it represented the 300th win for head coach Brion Treadway. After the 1-3 trip to Florida, all four subsequent losses came in extra innings. Senior Kade Bowling (St. Peter in Chains) and juniors Cade Cummins (St. Peter in Chains) and Caleb Driessen (Summit Country Day) were named First Team all-Ohio.







5. Comulgar si estas confesado.

Uno de los principales requisitos para comulgar, es estar confesado para recibir a Jesús Eucaristía en estado de Gracia.

6. Vestir presentable y respetuosamente

Cuidar la forma de vestir para evitar distracciones en los asistentes. No vestir de una manera desalineada. Tampoco forzosamente formal, pero si presentable y respetuosa para la casa de Dios. (Ser Continuado....)

Conoce tus derechos en tu casa, lugar de trabajo o en la calle.

Si las autoridades migratorias llegan a tu casa:

- Mantén la calma y no abras la puerta.
- No huyas.
- No reveles tu situación migratoria.
- Pide la orden judicial de arresto y/o resgistro. Si la tienen, pide que la muestren por la ventana y revisa que tenga tu nombre, dirección y la firma del juez.
- Si no tienen una orden judicial, puedes negarles el acceso.

*Recuerda que una orden administrativa del ICE (forma I-200, I-205) no les da autorización para entrar a tu casa.

Guarda silencio.

Pide hablar con el Consulado y no reveles tu situación migratoria. Comunicate con tu abogado. No firmes nada que no entiendas. Averigua qué agencia te arrestó (sheriff, departamento

Solicita un intérprete y una fianza.

Elabora un plan familiar
