I, the undersigned pastor, understand and agree that parents and pastors are called to work harmoniously in fulfilling the evangelizing mission of the Church by taking joint responsibility for ensuring that children receive suitable instruction prior to the reception of the sacraments. I understand and agree that while parents are the "principal and first educators of their children" (CCC 1653), it is for the pastor to judge that children are properly disposed and suitably instructed before allowing them to receive the sacraments and that such judgment must be made in light of the minimum requirements of canon law. I understand and agree that this may require prior to the reception of the sacrament an assessment or interview given by the pastor or his catechetical leader to determine readiness, in accord with canonical norms, respecting the age and intellectual capability of each of the faithful. I further understand and agree that the faithful have the right to receive the sacraments (can. 213) and that the sacraments cannot be denied to those who fulfill the basic canonical requirements for receiving them (can. 843 §1). Consequently, I understand and agree that if a member of the Christian faithful meets the basic canonical requirements for the reception of the sacrament, even if he/she has not fulfilled the requirements of a given parish catechetical program or diocesan expectations, he/she cannot be refused the sacrament. ### Requisite Documents

Parents must present a copy of the candidate's baptismal certificate or certificate of reception into the Catholic Church.

# Copies of the Agreement Form

A copy of the signed and dated agreement form should be given to: 1) the parents, 2) the pastor, 3) if applicable, the pastor of the parish catechetical program where the child is being prepared, and 4) if applicable, the rector of the church/oratory where the reception of the sacraments will occur.

#### Scheduling the Interview

At least one month prior to the scheduled reception of the sacrament, the parents are to contact the pastor in order to arrange for the aforementioned assessment or interview given by the pastor or his catechetical leader to determine readiness in accord with the norms of canon law.

## Sacramental Records and Certificates

Regarding confession, it is impossible to provide a certificate of confession or for there to be any record of a sacramental confession, since the priest hearing a confession is bound by the sacramental seal (c. 983). Regarding the reception of First Eucharist, there is no requirement that it be recorded (c. 535). However, if a pastor or parish catechetical leader wishes to record it, it should be recorded in the register of the parish where the sacrament was received.
