#### Music Ministry Opportunities

As you look to the year 2025 and how you could serve at Saint Andrew, please consider one (or more) of the following opportunities within the Music Ministry:

Cantor: Cantors help lead the congregation in singing hymns and serve as the psalmist during each of the weekend Masses and Holy Days of Obligation. Requirements are the ability to sing in tune, self-assurance, a strong voice, and the ability to learn music independently. Scheduling is rotated through our scheduling software, and music for the Mass is provided in advance. Coaching is available as needed.

Adult Choir: The Adult Choir ministry supports the songs of the people, enriching congregational singing with harmonies and descants, and presents choral works from various periods and styles to heighten texts and enrich the liturgy. The choir rehearses on Wednesday evening from 7:15 to 8:45 PM and generally sings on Sunday mornings.

Sunday 5:15 Schola: The Schola experience is especially geared toward our college students, youth ministry students, and young adults who like to attend the Sunday 5:15 PM Mass. The group meets at 3:30 PM on Sundays during the academic year to prepare music for that evening's Mass, as well as to work on choral motets and chants to enhance upcoming liturgies.

HymnDingers (Handchimes): The HymnDingers play at various Masses throughout the academic year, embellishing hymns, service music, and choral anthems as well as playing standalone pieces. Ability to read music is helpful but not required; chimers will learn to read music as part of the rehearsal process. The Choir Chime Ensemble meets on Wednesday evenings following daily Mass. This is a great group to join if you enjoy teamwork and are more shy about singing in one of the other groups.
