Well, Assistant Sacristans definitely work behind the scenes! Our Assistant

Sacristans, also incredibly important for Mass preparation, often do their work during the week. These are the individuals who clean all our liturgical linens used for Mass – not only do they wash the linens, they iron and fold them according to strict standards, based on how the linens are used. Our Assistant Sacristans also fill the holy water fonts at the entrances of church, clean up the sinks and counters in the sacristies, and dust the fixtures in the sanctuary.

These are all critical jobs that need to completed regularly, so once again, I feel deeply indebted to our Assistant Sacristan volunteers. Many of these individuals prefer to assist in ways that do not place them in the spotlight, so to speak. If that resonates with you as you consider how you might serve our parish, let me know!
