

Live your Discipleship

Corpus Christi is here. The real Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The first reading for this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ ends with Abram giving the high priest Melchizedek a tenth of everything. *Please remember to give generously to your parish*. You know that I couldn't resist that.

The Gospel tells us of the miracle of the loaves and the fish. While Jesus was certainly caring for the crowds, He uses this miracle to teach his Apostles that He is indeed divine. Slowly, his Apostles more deeply accept that Jesus is the Son of God, the Messiah. They come to accept this so deeply that they do not question that their Master instituted the Eucharist with His own Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity at the Last Supper.

The Apostles understood the Real Presence, as did all of the early Church Fathers, as we do today. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Why do we have Eucharistic Processions?

Eucharistic Processions trace their beginnings back to the late 1200s,

when Pope Urban first established the feast of *Corpus Christi*. Today, we refer to this special Sunday as The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. While some countries have maintained the tradition of a procession over the centuries, the tradition of Eucharistic Processions is spreading throughout the United States.

Having a Eucharistic procession offers an opportunity for Catholics to serve as public witnesses to Christ. We do believe that the Eucharist is the real presence of Jesus in the world today. Processing throughout our neighborhoods with the Eucharist transported in a monstrance communicates how much we value the real presence of Jesus in our immediate communities.

A procession of the Eucharist also offers a particular blessing upon our surrounding neighbors. Pope Benedict put it this way, "We entrust these streets, these homes, our daily

life, to his goodness. May our streets be streets of Jesus! May our houses be homes for him and with him! May our life of every day be penetrated by his presence."

What a beautiful way to bless our mission field!

WHAT: a public proclamation of our belief that Jesus is fully present in the Eucharist: body, blood, soul, and divinity.



WHY: "to publicly adore, praise, and thank the Lord, who continues to 'love us to the end'" (Benedict XVI) HOW: a consecrated host, placed into a monstrance, is carried in a procession outside of church.



WHEN: The Solemnity of Corpus Christi on Sunday, June 22nd after the 10:00 Mass



WHERE: starts in church, processes down Pine St., west on Prospect to Xavier High School, & back to church

SVdP is Here for Neighbors in Need

A Vincentian from our St. Vincent de Paul St. Bernard Conference recently met with the Johnson family—a

family of eight who had just relocated to our area. With six children and a newly rented townhouse, they were doing their best to start fresh, but they had almost no furniture.

Dad had quickly advanced from fast-food employee to store manager, earning a stable income to support his family. Mom stays home to care for their children, including three not yet in school. Despite their hard work and optimism, the family's most urgent need was clear: beds. The parents were sleeping on an air mattress, and the children on a couch or the floor. Our Vincentian prayed with the Johnsons—thanking God for the blessings they had and trusting Him to provide for what they still lacked.

Our Vincentian first contacted another local organization, but no beds were available. Undeterred, he provided the Johnson family with a furniture voucher for one queen bed and three twin beds through SVdP's own Voucher Program. That's a lot of beds to request at once—but thanks to the generosity of donors in our community, the need was met immediately. That very day, the Johnsons borrowed a truck and picked up their new beds: grateful, excited, and finally able to sleep with comfort and dignity. Receiving those beds freed up their limited income to go toward other monthly expenses.

Thanks to the ongoing generosity of donors, St. Vincent de Paul was able to support the Johnson family during a crucial time. Your contributions, whether furniture, financial gifts, or prayers, make it possible for SVdP to care for neighbors in need. Helping families like the Johnsons meet their basic needs through compassion and service is the core of SVdP's mission.


