Live your Discipleship

Welcome to the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Let's talk about liturgy. In my role here since coming to the parish, I have been learning a lot about what it takes for good liturgy to happen. It is not something that was on my plate in my previous assignment, so it has been an eye-opening experience.

It usually starts with the readings. For instance, the readings of this Sunday in Ordinary Time, are not exactly ordinary. The Gospel tells us of the beginning of Christ's public ministry and the calling of his first four followers, Simon, Andrew, James, and John. The first reading from Isaiah tells of God bringing great joy to people who had "dwelt in the land of gloom." The second reading from Paul urges Christians to stay united in Christ.

So, the themes of Jesus starting His mission, Apostles answering God's call, God bringing people from gloom into great rejoicing, and Christian unity will be woven into all the music of the Mass: gathering, presentation, communion, and recessional songs, and in a prelude or other piece of music, depending on the Mass.

But that is not all. We will want to adjust the prayers of the faithful to account for the intention of the Mass and other items. Is a Sunday (or weekday) a Marian feast? Will we need flowers? Is the weekend a change of liturgical seasons - then we will need to change all the colors in the Sanctuary. Holy Week and the Christmas season just add to the liturgical nuances.

As we come together as a community at the Sacrifice of the Mass, I urge you to contemplate and appreciate how the many elements of the liturgy fit together to help us do the most important thing we do - worship our God. We truly have wonderful liturgy here at St Bernard.

Please join me in being grateful for our staff and volunteers who make it happen. God Bless.




