## La Salle Pastorate Cemetery Guidelines

Holy Cross, Holy Cross; Holy Trinity, Luxemburg; St Francis of Assisi, Balltown; St Joseph Rickardsville; Saints Peter and Paul, Sherrill

These rules apply to all the cemeteries of the La Salle Pastorate as of November 1, 2025

#### Easements

Easements are purchased through the cemetery trustees of the individual cemeteries

- -1 Plot for a parishioner of the La Salle Pastorate is \$500
- -1 Plot for a non-parishioner is \$1000

(A non-parishioner is anyone who is not a registered member of one of the La Salle Pastorate parishes)

- -Up to three remains can be buried in a grave, one full body and up to two cremated remains
- -Easements cannot be purchased back by the cemetery, but must be sold to another purchaser and cannot be sold for more than the original purchase price
- -Payment is made at the time of purchase, no graves will be held
- -Graves are sold in order (ex. Row A Grave 1, Row A Grave 2...)
- -Pricing and easements of "older" sections are left to the discretion of the trustees to establish

### **Cremated Remains**

- -Cremated remains must be buried in a whole purchased plot
- -Cremated remains can be buried in a plot that has been purchased and already has a full body burial
- -There is a limit of three cremated remains per-plot (without a full body burial)
- -If there is a full body burial in the plot, two cremains can be buried on top
- -The fee for a burial of cremains in a purchased plot is \$300 (only if the person being buried was not the purchaser of the plot i.e. a son on top of his parents who were the owners of the plot)
- -Holes for cremated remains need to be at least 2 feet deep

# Maps/Register

- -The cemetery trustees will inform the office of purchases or transfers by the end of the fiscal year (June) so the office can update the office copy of the maps/register (although they can update the office at the time of purchase as well)
- -When an easement is purchased, cemetery trustees will update their own maps and communicate with the other trustee so that they can update their map/register
- -Cemetery trustees will ensure a copy of the map/register/ledger of plots and easements is in the office

### Cemetery Fees

- -Opening fees of coffin/full-body burials are the responsibility of the funeral home to organize with trustees
- -50% of easement purchases must go into perpetual care accounts
- -25% will go to cemetery savings, 25% will go to cemetery checking
- -\$100 of the cremated remains burial fee goes to the digger of the grave. They can donate the amount to the cemetery
- -\$200 of the cremated remain burial fee will go to perpetual care

## Monuments and Decorations

- -Foundations and monument guidelines are set by the trustees, and all are subject to approval
- -Decorations may not hinder care of the cemetery, including mowing, and the cemetery assumes no responsibility for them

-The care of monuments and foundations is assumed by the purchaser and their heirs
