My dear parishioners and friends of Mary Help of Christians,

Blessed Carlo Acutis and Pier Georgio Frassati are now Saints!



We rejoice as Pope Leo raised to the heights of the altar and declared Carlo Acutis (15-year-old) and Pier Georgio Frassati (24-year-old) as saints – models for today's teens and young adults. They enjoyed life, as well as following Jesus, and making a difference in our world reaching, out to help others.

The following five facts about St. Carlo Acutis are taken from the Facebook page of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles:

- 1. Carlo was born in London, England in 1991. Not long after his birth, his family moved back to Italy.
- 2. He played video games. He was a typical sports loving, video game playing, tech-savvy teenager. His favorite video games were said to be Halo, Mario, and Pokémon.
- 3. Carlo was a devout Catholic from a young age, although his parents were not particularly devout. After he received his First Holy Communion, he went to Mass every single day, and his deep spirituality led to a renewal of faith in his mother.
- 4. Carlo used his love of computers to help share Christ with others. He created a website documenting different Eucharistic miracles around the world to help lead others to a greater love for the Eucharist.
- 5. Carlo Acutis is known as the "First Millennial Saint." This reminds us that saints are not just priests, religious and those who lived centuries ago. We are still called to holiness and sainthood today.

Pier Giorgio Frassati, born in 1901 in Turin, Italy, grew up in privilege as the son of a wealthy newspaper owner and a diplomat. Yet he never sought comfort or recognition — his heart belonged to God and to those in need.

He was known for sneaking out to bring food, clothes, and medicine to the poor, often giving away his own belongings without telling his family. For Pier Giorgio, holiness was not something lofty or distant – it was lived out in the streets, in friendship, in joy, and in self-giving love.

He loved the outdoors and spent countless hours climbing mountains, always encouraging his friends to live faith at great heights, both physically and spiritually. His favorite phrase, "Verso l'alto" ("To the heights"), became a motto for his life and continues to inspire young people today.

At just 24 years old, Pier Giorgio contracted polio, most likely from the sick he served. He died offering his suffering to God, his funeral overflowing with the poor he had quietly helped. Today he is canonized a Saint, recognized as a patron of young people, students, and mountaineers.



Why A Vigil Light?

The subject of light is frequently referred to in the Bible.
Jesus said of Himself: "I am the Light of the world." (John 8:12)
Therefore, if we try to live according to His teaching and example,

we will not "walk in darkness."

A VIGIL light, as the name suggests, is one that symbolically "keeps watch" for us before the Lord when we cannot be physically present to pray in that particular place.

As we fulfill our daily responsibilities in our homes or places of work and business, the burning light symbolically expresses our petitions, our praise and our thanksgiving to God.




