(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC – THE DIVINE CONFIDANTE

The Divine Confidante By Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

My husband pretty much knows that if he tells me something — anything — he's also telling my sister. Most of us have that person that we run to when we have important information. I'm not even talking about gossip; I'm talking about stuff we just have to discuss. We joke that I don't really know how I feel about something until I've run it by my sister first. There's not really anything wrong with that. When we're trying to figure out how to think about something that has happened or how to react to a certain situation, it's always helpful to get the opinion of someone we trust. But what if we ran as quickly to discuss the situation with God as we did to discuss it with our "person?" Wouldn't that be ideal? After witnessing the transfiguration — an event that had to have been as confusing as it was astounding — we hear that the disciples "fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen." When something profound, frightening, or confusing happens, our first confidente should be God. I'm reminded of Luke 2:19: "Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart." There is something to be said for taking a moment to keep that information sacred between ourselves and the One who can really help us confront it. Sure, maybe we don't understand what just happened. Maybe we're scared by it. We don't really know how we feel about it. And that's totally okay. The divine confidante knows how to help us pray through that confusion, that fear. If you're someone's "person" and they come to you wanting to talk, that's great. Talk it out. But remind them — and remind yourself — to pray about it as much as you talk about it. DeRouchey's Delight

Dear faith family,

Happy Lent!!!

As we journey through this Lenten season, may we truly take time to grow deeper in our relationship with Christ as we move to imitate Him in our daily lives.

Part of our preparation for the great feast of Easter is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As one of the precepts of our faith, the Easter obligation is to receive the Holy Eucharist during the Easter season; however, to receive the sacrament in the state of grace we are called to examine our conscience and make a sincere confession.

Yet, some may ask why the focus on reconciliation at this time of year? The answer is simple, because it is the time leading up to the commemoration of Our Lord's death for our sins and the commemoration of His resurrection for our salvation. It is especially appropriate to mourn the sins for which He died. We, as humans, have an innate psychological need to mourn tragedies and our sins are tragedies of the greatest sort. Due to our fallen nature, we also have a need to have set times in which to engage in behavior (which is why we have Sundays as a set time to rest and worship), it is appropriate to have set times of repentance. Lent is one of those times set aside to look within ourselves as we examine our lives and seek the forgiveness of God.

Question – will we allow ourselves to go through another Lenten season without seeking the gift of Reconciliation – the removal of the burden of carrying our sins through our daily lives? For those who may have mortal sin (a deliberate act against God and one of His commandments), each time one receives the Holy Eucharist in the state of mortal sin is another act of sacrilege. For example, deliberately missing Sunday Mass or Holy Day of Obligation, receiving the Eucharist while not in a valid marriage, sexually involved with someone who is not your valid spouse or use of any form of contraception. Why continue to carry the weight of these sins when God extends to each of us the gift of the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

In addition to our regular scheduled confession times, next Sunday – March 23rd, we will celebrate our Lenten Penance Service at Saints Peter and Paul at 3:30pm with Father Gerry and Father Gary. Later, at 6:00pm, we will celebrate our Lenten Penance Service at Sacred Heart with Father Ken, Father Gerry, and Father Gary. Each station will have available confession, both face-to-face and behind the screen. Saint Paul the Apostle will celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation following Stations on April 11th with Father Ken and Father Gary.

Often, I am reminded of the need for patience in the confessional line. As the confessor, I like to provide my full attention to the individual who is present for the sacrament and give them the time they need in the confessional. For me, it seems like it is but a few seconds. However, when waiting in the confession line, it is a different story. It seems like it takes hours for individuals to get through and the impatience grows greater with each second that ticks away on the clock. One may wonder what sins they possibility could have committed to have to be in the confessional for such a LONG time. Yet, this time gives us the opportunity to re-examine our conscience as well as pray for the persons who are participating in the sacrament that they may be truly open to its grace. However, the confessional is NOT a counseling session. Be prepared as you enter into the confessional. There are aids available to assist in preparing for sacrament, especially for examining one's conscience. Remember – the Sacrament of Reconciliation is for you to acknowledge and seek forgiveness for YOUR sins and not of others.

Additional devotion offered during Lent is the Stations of the Cross. It is one of the oldest devotions in the Catholic Church and is one of the most highly indulgenced devotions of the Church. It is both a public and private devotion. Every Church and Chapel must have the 14 Stations of the Cross. There are no set rules to gain the indulgences. You may say some prayers or simply meditate on the scene presented. You may even make it personal. If you have any questions concerning obtaining these indulgences, please talk with me. Please join us in praying this beautiful devotion of our faith – either in public celebration or in private prayer. Stations will be prayed as a community this week on Wednesday at Saints Peter & Paul with the students at 7:00pm with the Sacrament of Reconciliation following and on Friday at Saint Paul the Apostle at 6:00pm.

Thursday noon – brown baggin' Bible study as we continue our journey through the Gospel of Matthew as we conclude the Sermon on the Mount. All are welcome to join.

Sacred Heart. Coming.... A Fireside Chat or the "State of Union" address on March 25th at 6:30pm, which will be the status of our parish. We will discuss the current financial position of our faith family, the present projects and future projects. Please plan to join in our discussion.
