Saint Dominic's music ministry continued to thrive in the past year. We were blessed to have several college students join our adult choir, and we were able to expand our choral repertoire further with the support of our new organ. A group of talented college students provided music for one mass per month. We also developed a small Youth Schola, composed of mostly high school aged students, who sang monthly.

The new organ was initiated with a spectacular fall concert by one of our former accompanists, Martha Barth, and we expanded our parish roster of accompanists by two, as well as another organist.

Finally, we closed out the school year with another delightful week of choir camp, once again drawing nearly 30 enthusiastic singers from both our own parish and neighboring ones.

On July 1, 2025 we welcomed Father Justus Musinguzi as our Parochial Vicar. A Ugandan national, Fr. Justus felt called to the priesthood at the early age of ten and was finally ordained a priest in 2001. He has served the Church in different counties, dioceses, parishes and positions. Already a multilingual servant of God, Fr. Justus is beginning to learn Spanish too! We look forward to his leadership and guidance here at St. Dominic. We are blessed that he is here.

LITURGY

Beautifying the sanctuary during the various liturgical seasons is one of the liturgy committee's largest tasks. This year we used over 80 poinsettias at Christmas time and over 50 lilies, as well as other spring flowers, during the Easter season. New this year, we created bilingual booklets for the Triduum services, enabling worshipers to follow along and participate in English or Spanish. We are grateful for and rely on our volunteers to keep the church decorated, candles in the chapel, and serving in our liturgical ministries to keep weekend services running smoothly. THEOLOGY OF THE BODY

Students in grades K-8 at St. Dominic School are learning Theology of the Body (TOB) this year. These supplemental lessons will be taught alongside our religion curriculum. TOB is an understanding of what it means to be human. Our students will discover the very foundations of our authentic identity as human persons created in the image and likeness of God, male and female. Why are we here? What does it mean to love? How do we find real happiness? Through prayer, stories, thought-provoking questions, and activities we will begin to explore the wonderful answers to life's questions through the lens of God's design, plan and purpose.

The Theology of the Body (TOB) refers to the collection of 129 Wednesday Audiences, or short public speeches, given by St. John Paul II during the first five years of his papacy. TOB helps us to understand the very foundation of our identity created in God's image as male or female.

Faith Formation

YOUTH FAITH FORMATION

It is clear that the Church of St. Dominic cares about our youth. This past year our *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* (CGS) atriums moved to a new space in the former convent, giving them their own space. There was a need for additional space, thus, we have now doubled their classroom space in the convent for the 2025-26 school year. Many new “works” were introduced to the children and two catechists received CGS Level 2 training off-site in order to teach more advanced lessons.

Elementary age students met in the school classrooms, also giving them more room. They continued to use the Blessed program and the *Discover! Finding Faith in Life* curriculum. Middle school and confirmation students met at the church and convent, and using the *Y-Disciple* program and *Catholic Faith Handbook*, participated in rich discussions about our faith. In preparation for Confirmation, the students in their second year of preparation enjoyed a jam-packed, faith-filled retreat at St. Dominic Church.

We are grateful for the many youth and parents who participated in our annual pie making fundraiser. Several local businesses donated ingredients and a group of youth were able to help pick apples this year. Many families jumped in to help what made for a fun day of making pies. (There may have been a little competition going on the pie-making assembly lines!) A record-breaking 164 pies were made and thanks to the support of our parishioners, the money earned was used for programming and activities in our parish. Thank you to all who contributed.

There have been many wonderful opportunities for our parish family to grow in faith. Adoration continues every Wednesday-Saturday. In September we hosted our third annual Women's Welcome Retreat. Many participated in the Eucharist and Rosary processions as we sang and prayed in our community, and Fr. Cassian Sama came and spoke on "The Beauty and Power of the Rosary." In January, on the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, parishioners traveled on a day pilgrimage for Mass and an in-depth tour of the Cathedral of St. Paul, gathering for dinner afterward, and in June, a group of parishioners pilgrimaged to Rome with Fr. Louie. Many participated in the six week "Return" book study, as well as the "Rosary In A Year" podcast for which a group of parishioners continues to meet monthly for prayer and reflections. Several small groups meet regularly not only for prayer and formation, but also for social events. One small group hosted a Sedar Meal at the Convent, building community in conjunction with faith.

CAPITAL NEEDS



In the last fiscal year we had one major capital improvement project. Last fall we made significant changes to the convent. Previously, aside from two large living spaces and a kitchen, there were eight small bedrooms. With the skills of amazing volunteers, we were able to remove some of the interior walls, making four larger sized rooms. Additionally, some electrical was moved, all of the carpeting was replaced, luxury vinyl plank was added to the two large open living spaces, and the entire interior was painted. With a generous furniture donation and wonderful decorations, the space looks amazing and is already well used by many groups during the week. If you have not seen the space yet, please stop by the office and ask for a tour! The total cost to remodel the convent was \$25,106 with the majority of the cost being flooring. Approximately \$18,000 was raised from the St. Dominic raffle and other donations. Thanks to the talents and willingness to help of many volunteers, we were able to keep the cost to the parish low.



Other large projects included the installation of a new fire panel at the school, Knox boxes being installed at three entrances, and concrete sidewalks being added to the west side of the school to allow students to safely escape in case of emergency. We are constantly working to make our facilities safer and better

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE—Growth for Generations

All families need to make sure that they are fulfilling their current financial obligations while at the same time planning for their future. The same is true for the church. This is why on December 12, 2024, St. Dominic's established "St. Dominic Parish Endowment Fund." The Fund is a perpetual endowment designed to provide stable, ongoing support to our parish - forever. The fund is legally protected. The principal is not allowed to be withdrawn, however, each year we have the option to receive a grant from the fund—currently 4%. Our current plan is to not take any distributions and allow the money to grow.

The purpose for creating this fund is to provide future generations of Catholics in Northfield with an additional source of funding to help balance future budgets. If you wish to join us in providing for the future, you can make a donation via the envelope titled, "Parish Endowment Fund" that comes in the giving envelope packets. If you prefer online giving, our new website allows you to set up a one-time or recurring gift to the Parish Endowment Fund.

Lastly, this past fiscal year St. Dominic's finally received the Employee Retention Credit from the IRS. In addition to the credit we received \$98,717.35 in interest. Being that this interest was completely unexpected, the decision was made to place all of it into the Parish Endowment Fund. I am proud that our Finance Council was in agreement that, even while we struggle at times to meet the weekly budget, it is still necessary to plan for the future now! We want future generations of Catholics to benefit from what was begun today.

Financial Update



We are happy to share that our Sunday giving increased by \$40,488 from \$916,324 to \$956,812, this fiscal year. This is the second year in a row that our Collections increased. You will remember that for most of the year we were behind our Collections budget. We are grateful for the very strong response to our June special request, eventually exceeding our Collections budget for the fiscal year.

For fiscal year 2025 (July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025), our total income was \$2,667,600 and our total expenses were \$2,160,126, resulting in an operating surplus of **\$507,474**. Our income includes \$209,077 in parish ERC money and \$270,191 in school ERC money. The employee retention credit (ERC) was for retaining employees in 2020 and 2021.

Beyond normal operations: there was \$8,658 in cemetery income, less \$160 in restricted expenses, plus \$123,934 in investment income. Including this income, our overall surplus is **\$639,907**.

The following investments for the future were made: \$98,717.35 parish permanent endowment (See separate article); \$55,000 Agency Fund with CCF; \$80,000 School Endowment and \$75,000 school CD.

Looking forward, the budget for the current fiscal year (2025-26) has a projected operating shortfall of \$120,617. This budget deficit does not include any restricted income and investment income, which was \$123,774 this year. Hopefully, this non-operating income will be similar and cause an overall surplus again next fiscal year.

NEW COLLEGE MINISTRY

Looking ahead! This coming year we are committed to focusing on our college aged young adults. It is a parish ministry that supports—spiritually, materially, and morally—our young people. They need guidance and support as they grow. We are connecting with both colleges with monthly celebrations of the Mass, Retreats, prayer, social events, and our L.O.C.K. Card Ministry. We look forward to connecting with them as they seek knowledge, truth, and vocation.

CALVARY CEMETERY

Calvary Cemetery has been in existence since 1857. As Catholics we believe in the resurrection of our bodies after death and this requires that our bodies or cremains must be respectfully buried in sacred ground. There were 10 cremation and 3 casket burials this past year. The budget for Calvary Cemetery is based mainly on the sale of full-size or cremation graves in addition to grave openings/closings. Calvary Cemetery falls under the umbrella of the Church of St. Dominic but its finances are kept separate. This past year (July 2024-June 2025) we sold 9 full-size graves and 1 cremation grave for a total of \$11,850. This was a decrease of \$23,400 from the previous year. The total income for 2024-2025 was \$26,370 and the total expenses were \$36,407.65. Expenses included grave openings/closings, fuel, mowing, repairs and maintenance (which included re-roofing the maintenance building and seal coating the drive-ways), utilities, supplies, liability/property insurance, and professional fees. Total expenses increased by \$19,048 from the previous year. The Board of Directors consists of two Co-Presidents and one secretary/treasurer who volunteer their time. In addition, the cemetery employs one person who mows the lawn. Calvary is well maintained and a beautiful place to bury and visit your loved ones. The Cemetery has many full-size and cremation graves available for purchase when you are considering your burial options.



It has been another year of wonderful opportunities to connect with our parish family—from regular Donut Sundays to summer evening family potluck picnics. Special feast day celebrations continued for our Patron St. Dominic and for Our Lady of Guadalupe. Fr. Louie blessed our pets in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, encouraged us to bless our homes on the Feast of the Epiphany, and gave a special blessing for expectant mothers. We gathered for prayer and broke bread together at our simple Lenten Soup Suppers.

Small groups continued to gather to grow in faith and togetherness. Many parishioners came out for our first Pizza, Puzzles, and Pitchers event with enthusiasm and a competitive spirit, as well as for the Bishop Dudley Open Golf Tournament. The KC's fed us with delicious breakfasts and a Fish Fry, and gave us a chance to try our luck at Turkey Bingo. There was never a shortage of laughter, comradery, or dishes to wash!

We are so grateful for the many hours volunteers take to plan these special events and for those who attend them.
