VII. Recording Marriages

- A. All marriages between two Catholics are to be recorded in the place where the marriage is celebrated.
- B. All mixed marriages which take place according to the Catholic form of marriage (before a priest and two witnesses) are to be recorded in the place where the marriage is celebrated.
- C. All marriages which have received the dispensation from canonical form (i.e., which take place before a non-Catholic minister) are to be recorded in the place where the couple was prepared for marriage (usually, but not always, the place of matrimonial domicile or residence of the Catholic party).
- D. In addition to recording marriages in the marriage register, all marriages are to be recorded in the baptismal register of the Catholic party (or parties); under "Notes" (or "Remarks," etc.), the following should be recorded: name of spouse, date of marriage, place of wedding, name of minister, as well as all dispensations and permissions.
- E. All permissions and dispensations are to be recorded in the last column of the marriage register (described usually as "Remarks" or "Notitiae").

- A. The Wedding Mass on Saturday evening, i.e., after 4:00 p.m., or Sunday in Ordinary time at a parish Mass, should use the Mass of the day, but substituting one of the readings from the Wedding Mass and adding the Nuptial Blessing and final solemn blessing may be done.
- B. No substitution of readings is permitted when the wedding is celebrated during the following times or days:

Easter Triduum	Sundays of Advent
Christmas	Ash Wednesday
Epiphany	Sundays of Lent
Ascension	Weekdays of Holy Week
Pentecost	Octave of Easter
All Soule/ Day	No. A statement of the state of the state
Solemnities of the	Lord, the Blessed Virgin and saints
in the general	calendar
Proper solemnities	, e.g., a parish's patronal feast.

C. Attendance at a Wedding Mass on Saturday after 4:00 p.m. or on Sunday, whether or not celebrated at the time of a regular parish Mass, fulfills the Sunday or Holy Day obligation (even if the above norms are violated).
