ask forgiveness for the abuses
in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis:
abuses of power, of conscience and sexual abuse
perpetrated by members
with roles of responsibility in the Church.

We ask forgiveness for the times
that as a Church
we did not show survivors of all kinds of abuse:
compassion and the search for justice and truth
through concrete actions.

We ask forgiveness for some members
of the Church's hierarchy
who did not take charge of these painful situations
and kept quiet.

Lord, sustain and increase this state of shame
and repentance
and give us the strength to commit ourselves
so that these things never happen again,
and justice may be done.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.
