Eucharistic Adoration & Guided Prayer

We will reflect on two Gospel passages:

- The Great Commission (Matthew 28:18–20)
- The Vine and the Branches (John 15:1–11)

Take time to listen, pray, and journal what the Lord places on your heart.

Reflection 1

“Go, therefore, and make disciples...”

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

“Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.”

What difference does Jesus make in your life?

Why do you want to be Jesus' disciple?

Jesus says, "baptize them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all that I have commanded you."

Reflection 2

“Remain in me...”

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

“I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father’s commandments and remain in his love. “I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete. How precious to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!”

What may need to be pruned in our parish life so that we can bear more fruit?

What fruit could come if we worked more closely with another parish?

Litany of Trust (Respond *Jesus, I trust in You* after each invocation.)

That You are continually holding me, sustaining me, loving me.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That Your love goes deeper than my sins and failings, and transforms me.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That not knowing what tomorrow brings is an invitation to lean on You.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That You are with me in my suffering

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That my suffering, united to Your own, will bear fruit in this life and the next.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That You will not leave me orphan, and You are present in Your Church.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That Your plan is better than anything else.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That You always hear me and, in Your goodness, always respond to me.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That You give me the grace to accept forgiveness and to forgive others.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That You give me all the strength I need for what is asked.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That my life is a gift.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That You will teach me to trust you.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That You are my Lord and my God.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*

That I am Your beloved one.

- *Jesus, I trust in you.*
