Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

I recently found a copy of a book written by my great uncle. He was a historian from Corydon, Indiana and his book cataloged some of the history of our family. It was fascinating to look at the pictures and read the stories of some of my ancestors. However, there were pictures not included and stories that were not written in the book. While this book was fascinating to me, I know that the story of my family is not limited to what can be written down.

In many ways, the same can be said of God's revelation of Himself to humanity. The Church, beginning with the Apostles, transmits this revelation in two forms: Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture. The two are inseparably linked and we must never ignore the vast importance of either.

On occasion, one may hear a person criticize a teaching of the Church as "not being in the Bible." In doing so, they correctly recognize Scripture as a source of coming to know the Truth but are failing to appreciate Sacred Tradition. It is important to recognize that Scripture itself is an integral part of the Sacred Tradition.

When Jesus ascended to the Father, He commanded the Apostles to proclaim the Gospel to the

nations. He did not then hand them the first copy of the Bible and say "all you have to do is use this." Instead, the Apostles went forth and told the world what they had seen. Some of them would, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, write their teachings and stories down. These became some of our Gospels and Scriptural letters. (Indeed, it was the authority of the bishops of the early Church that declared which writings were part of the Canon of Scripture and which were not Scriptural).

All of this is said to encourage us to look at our bookshelves and nightstands. We all know that we need to read more Scripture and more often. Do we also realize that we need to spend time with other resources that teach the faith? Perhaps the best recommendation would be to ensure that you have a Catechism of the Catholic Church. The Catechism summarizes much of the Church's teachings and will help us to understand God's Revelation in a much fuller way.

Scripture and Tradition cannot be separated, and thank God for that!

### **DESDE EL PASTOR**

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

Recientemente encontré una copia de un libro escrito por mi tío abuelo. Fue un historiador de Corydon, Indiana y su libro catalogó parte de la historia de nuestra familia. Fue fascinante mirar las imágenes y leer las historias de algunos de mis antepasados. Sin embargo, hubo imágenes no incluidas e historias que no fueron escritas en el libro. Si bien este libro fue fascinante para mí, sé que la historia de mi familia no se limita a lo que se puede escribir.

En muchos sentidos, lo mismo puede decirse de la revelación de Dios a la humanidad. La Iglesia, comenzando por los Apóstoles, transmite esta revelación en dos formas: la Sagrada Tradición y la Sagrada Escritura. Los dos están inseparablemente vinculados y nunca debemos ignorar la gran importancia de ninguno de los dos.

En ocasiones, uno puede escuchar que una persona critica una enseñanza de la Iglesia como "no estar en la Biblia". Al hacerlo, reconocen correctamente la Escritura como una fuente de conocer la Verdad pero no están valorando la Sagrada Tradición. Es importante reconocer que la Escritura en sí misma es una parte integral de la Sagrada Tradición.

Cuando Jesús ascendió al Padre, ordenó a los Apóstoles que proclamaran el Evangelio a los naciones Luego no les entregó la primera copia de la Biblia y dijo: "todo lo que tienes que hacer es usar esto". En cambio, los apóstoles salieron y le dijeron al mundo lo que habían visto. Algunos de ellos, bajo la inspiración del Espíritu Santo, escribirán sus enseñanzas e historias. Estos se convirtieron en algunos de nuestros evangelios y cartas bíblicas. (De hecho, fue la autoridad de los obispos de la Iglesia primitiva la que declaró que los escritos eran parte del Canon de las Escrituras y que no eran bíblicas).

Se dice que todo esto nos anima a mirar nuestras estanterías y mesitas de noche. Todos sabemos que necesitamos leer más Escrituras y más a menudo. ¿También nos damos cuenta de que necesitamos pasar tiempo con otros recursos que enseñan la fe? Quizás la mejor recomendación sería asegurarse de tener un Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica. El Catecismo resume gran parte de las enseñanzas de la Iglesia y nos ayudará a comprender la Revelación de Dios de una manera mucho más completa.

¡La Escritura y la Tradición no pueden separarse, y gracias a Dios por eso!
