Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

As you know, there was a ten day pilgrimage to Italy these past two weeks and the memories from it will last a lifetime! Of course, the highlight of the trip was the Papal Audience with another Thirty Thousand people in Saint Peter's Square. Pope Francis passed within eight feet of us, riding in the "Pope mobile" throughout the square in order to greet the myriads who were there while he kissed and blessed more than a few babies.

The Holy Father offered a wonderful reflection on death and dying. He spoke at some length about the fact that most of us fear death because of the way it is portrayed in modern day communications. Most see death as an unavoidable consequence of life and, for some, as an end to it all. But, he said, Faith gives us a totally different view point. Our faith in Jesus and in His Resurrection assures us that this life is not all there is. In fact, faith teaches us that what lies beyond the boundaries of this life is far greater and more blessed than we can ever know this side of Paradise!

Pope Francis then reminded all who were present to think about what Jesus did for the daughter of Jairus. In the Gospel of both Saint Matthew and St. Mark we are told how Jesus went to the home of Jairus and told those

who questioned Him that she was not dead but asleep. Then Jesus went into the room where she was, took her by the hand and said, "Little one, rise up."

Pope Francis assured us all that when the passage-way of death opens for us, we need to believe that Jesus Himself will take us by the hand and say, "Little one, rise up." Rise up, said the Pope, to newness of life; take the hand of Jesus and let Him lead you to the Kingdom of the Father. Trust that the Lord of Life will not abandon you or leave you alone. He will extend His hand, ask you to grasp it and walk with Him into the eternity of the Father! It was a most comforting moment to hear the Holy Father explain the mystery of death in such a vivid and faith-filled way. It gives one strength to face the final moments of existence here in a serene and certain way; knowing that the Word of Life will never leave us alone.

While I may write again about some of the experiences of our pilgrimage, I will not forget this most important one. May the words of Papa Francisco bring peace and comfort to you, Monsignor

DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

Como saben, hubo una peregrinación de diez días a Italia en las últimas dos semanas y sus recuerdos durarán toda la vida. Por supuesto, lo más destacado del viaje fue la audiencia papal con otras treinta mil personas en la Plaza de San Pedro. El Papa Francisco pasó a menos de dos metros de nosotros, montando en el "móvil del Papa" por toda la plaza para saludar a las miríadas que estaban allí mientras besaba y bendecía a más de unos pocos bebés.

El Santo Padre ofreció una maravillosa reflexión sobre la muerte. Habló extensamente sobre el hecho de que la mayoría de nosotros tememos a la muerte por la forma en que se la retrata en las comunicaciones modernas. La mayoría considera que la muerte es una consecuencia inevitable de la vida y, para algunos, un fin para todo. Pero, dijo, Fe de nos da un punto de vista totalmente diferente. Nuestra fe en Jesús y en su Resurrección nos asegura que esta vida no es todo lo que hay. De hecho, la fe nos enseña que lo que se encuentra más allá de los límites de esta vida es mucho más grande y más bendito de lo que jamás podamos conocer este lado del Paraíso.

El Papa Francisco recordó a todos los que estaban presentes que pensaran en lo que Jesús hizo por la hija de Jairo. En el Evangelio de San Mateo y San Marcos se nos cuenta cómo Jesús fue a la casa de Jairo y les dijo a los que le preguntaron que no estaba muerta sino dormida. Entonces Jesús entró en la habitación donde estaba, la tomó de la mano y dijo: "Pequeña, levántate".

El Papa Francisco nos aseguró a todos que cuando se abra el pasaje de la muerte para nosotros, debemos creer que Jesús mismo nos tomará de la mano y dirá: "Pequeña, levántate". Levántate, dijo el Papa, a la novedad de la vida; toma la mano de Jesús y deja que te guíe al Reino del Padre. Confie en que el Señor de la Vida no lo abandonará ni lo dejará en paz. ¡Él extenderá Su mano, le pedirá que la agarre y camine con Él en la eternidad del Padre! Fue un momento muy reconfortante escuchar al Santo Padre explicar el misterio de la muerte de una manera tan vívida y llena de fe. Da una fortaleza para enfrentar los momentos finales de existencia aquí de una manera serena y segura; sabiendo que la Palabra de Vida nunca nos dejará en paz.

Si bien puedo volver a escribir sobre algunas de las experiencias de nuestra peregrinación, no olvidaré esta más importante. Que las palabras de Papa Francisco te traigan paz y consuelo, Monseñor
