Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

On October 22nd Pope Francis offered the following reflection regarding the statement of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew: "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." (Mt.22: 19-21) He said: "The reference to Caesar's image engraved on the coin says that it is right that they feel fully—with rights and duties—citizens of the State; but symbolically it makes them think about the other image that is imprinted on every man and woman: the image of God. He is the Lord of all, and we, who were created 'in his image' belong to Him first and foremost.... Jesus reminds us—you belong to God. This is the fundamental belonging. It is He who has given you all that you are and have. And, therefore, day by day, we can and must live our life in recognition of this fundamental belonging and in heartfelt gratitude toward our Father, who creates each one of us individually, unrepeatable, but always according to the image of his beloved Son. Jesus.

Christians are called to commit themselves concretely in earthly realities, but illuminating them

with the light that comes from God...the diligent rendering to God that which belongs to him. This is why a believer looks to the future reality, that of God, so as to live earthly life to the fullest, and to meet its challenge with courage....let Christ reach you. Let Him speak to you, embrace you, console you, heal your wounds, dissolve your doubts and fears—and you shall be ready for the fascinating adventure of life, that precious and inestimable gift that God places every day in your hands.

Go to meet Jesus, be with Him in prayer, entrust yourselves to Him, give your whole life over to His merciful love and your faith will be the luminous witness of generosity and of the joy there is in following Him, wherever He should lead you."

If we accept these words and allow them to guide us, then the joy of Christian life will be seen within us and will, by the grace of God, inspire others to come with us, united with Christ Jesus, to seek, discover and recreate among us the Life and Love to which we are called. May God bless you efforts to accomplish that mission, Monsignor



DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

El 22 de octubre, el Papa Francisco ofreció la siguiente reflexión sobre la declaración de Jesús en el Evangelio de Mateo: "Por tanto, haz lo que es de Cesar para César, y para Dios lo que es de Dios" (Mt 22, 19-21) Él dijo: "La referencia a la imagen de César grabada en la moneda dice que es correcto que sienten completamente -con derechos y deberes- como ciudadanos del Estado; pero simbólicamente les hace pensar en la otra imagen que está impresa en cada hombre y mujer: la imagen de Dios. Él es el Señor de todos, y nosotros, que fuimos creados 'a su imagen', le pertenecemos ante todo ... Jesús nos recuerda: usted pertenece a Dios. Esta es la pertenencia fundamental. Es Él quien te ha dado todo lo que eres y tienes. Y, por lo tanto, día a día, podemos y debemos vivir nuestra vida en reconocimiento de esta pertenencia fundamental y de sincera gratitud hacia nuestro Padre, que nos crea a cada uno individualmente, irrepetible, pero siempre de acuerdo con la imagen de su Hijo amado, Jesús.

Los cristianos están llamados a comprometerse concretamente en las realidades terrenales, pero iluminándolas con la luz que proviene de Dios ... la diligente entrega a Dios de lo que le pertenece. Esta es la razón por la cual un creyente mira a la realidad futura, la de Dios, para vivir la vida terrenal al máximo, y enfrentar su desafío con coraje ... que Cristo te alcance. Deje que Él le hable, abrace, consuele, cure sus heridas, disuelva sus dudas y miedos, y estará listo para la fascinante aventura de la vida, ese precioso e inestimable regalo que Dios pone todos los días en sus manos. Id a encontrar a Jesús, estén con Él en oración, encomendados a Él, entregad toda vuestra vida a su amor misericordioso y vuestra fe será el testigo luminoso de la generosidad y del gozo que hay en seguirlo, donde sea que Él os guíe "
