Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

Pope Francis has, once again, offered us an ardent reflection on the presence of God in our life. He said: "Let us allow God to surprise us. He never tires of throwing open the doors of His Heart and repeats that He loves us and wants to share His Life with us. The Church feels the urgent need to proclaim God's mercy. Her life is authentic and credible only when she becomes a convincing herald of mercy. She knows that her primary task, especially at a moment full of great hopes and signs of contradiction, is to introduce everyone to the great mystery of God's mercy by contemplating the face of Christ.

The Church is called above all to be a credible witness to mercy, professing it and living it as the core of the revelation of Jesus Christ. From the heart of the Trinity, from the depth of the mystery of God, the great river of mercy wells up and overflows unceasingly. Every time someone is in need, he or she can approach it, because the mercy of God never ends....May she never tire of extending mercy and be ever patient in offering compassion and comfort. May the Church become the voice of every man and woman, and repeat confidently without end: 'Be mindful of Your mercy, O Lord, and Your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.' (Ps. 25:6)."

The old adage "practice makes perfect" certainly applies to the Church's ability to manifest the loving kindness of a merciful God. We ought never to tire of extending that gift to others; just as we never cease hoping for it to be given to us in our need for forgiveness and understanding. When we are able to recognize that we are called to a communion with each other we begin to see the importance of reaching out so that God reaches in to our hearts and lives. When we chose to exclude no one from the possibility of compassionate care and loving kindness, then we are reassured of the same gift returning to us in abundance.

As the holiday of Thanksgiving quickly approaches, let us seek to commit ourselves to sharing some kindness with someone else. It may be an invitation to a dinner, the gift of a hat and gloves, the simple embrace of friendship, or the commitment to help another through a perplexing time. Whatever form it takes, thankfulness is another way of manifesting the Body of Christ among us and that is a gift worth giving each and every day. Peace be with you, Monsignor

DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

El Papa Francisco, una vez más, nos ha ofrecido una ardiente reflexión sobre la presencia de Dios en nuestra vida. Él dijo: "Permitamos que Dios nos sorprenda. Él nunca se cansa de abrir las puertas de su corazón y repite que nos ama y quiere compartir su vida con nosotros. La Iglesia siente la urgente necesidad de proclamar la misericordia de Dios. Su vida es auténtica y creíble solo cuando se convierte en un convincente heraldo de la misericordia. Ella sabe que su tarea principal, especialmente en un momento lleno de grandes esperanzas y signos de contradicción, es presentar a todos al gran misterio de la misericordia de Dios al contemplar el rostro de Cristo.

La Iglesia es llamada ante todo para ser un testigo creíble de la misericordia, profesándola y viviéndola como el centro de la revelación de Jesucristo. Desde el corazón de la Trinidad, desde la profundidad del misterio de Dios, el gran río de la misericordia fluye y desborda sin cesar. Cada vez que alguien está necesitado, él o ella puede abordarlo, porque la misericordia de Dios nunca termina Puede que nunca se cansa de extender la misericordia y ser paciente ofreciendo compasión y consuelo. Que la Iglesia se convierta en la voz de todos los hombres y mujeres, y repita con confianza sin fin: "Sé consciente de tu misericordia, Señor, y de tu misericordia, porque es antigua" (Salmo 25: 6)."

El viejo adagio "la práctica hace la perfección" ciertamente se aplica a la capacidad de la Iglesia para manifestar la bondad amorosa de un Dios misericordioso. Nunca debemos cansarnos de extender ese regalo a otros; así como nunca dejamos de esperar que se nos conceda en nuestra necesidad de perdón y comprensión. Cuando somos capaces de reconocer que somos llamados a una comunión entre nosotros, comenzamos a ver la importancia de tender una mano para que Dios se acerque a nuestros corazones y nuestras vidas. Cuando elegimos excluir a nadie de la posibilidad de un cuidado compasivo y de bondad amorosa, entonces nos sentimos seguros de que el mismo regalo nos regresa en abundancia.

A medida que se acerca la festividad de Acción de Gracias, intentemos comprometernos a compartir algo de amabilidad con otra persona. Puede ser una invitación a una cena, el obsequio de un sombrero y guantes, el simple abrazo de la amistad, o el compromiso de ayudar a otra persona a través de un tiempo desconcertante. Cualquiera que sea la forma que tome, el agradecimiento es otra forma de manifestar el Cuerpo de Cristo entre nosotros y ese es un regalo que vale la pena dar todos los días.
