Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

I do not like to quibble over semantics or to exact precise, strict interpretations of basic principles of life. That resolution particularly applies to the Holy Season of Lent; especially in regards to whether or not one can "cheat" on the Sundays of Lent because, technically they "don't count"!

I will never forget Monsignor Dierker at St. Nicholas in Struthers, Ohio; a suburb of Youngstown. He was the third pastor under whom I was raised as a child (all three of whom were Monsignors!). When Monsignor visited the classrooms of the school, which happened every month, he often spoke of remembering to live "according to the spirit rather than the letter of the law." By that he meant that if we tried to figure out how to get around a particular principle, we were not trying to understand the reason why it existed in the first place! He further explained that if we took the Sundays of Lent as "free days" (because they are considered "little celebrations" of the Resurrection) we were trying to find a sneaky way into heaven!

It was in the eighth grade at St. Nicholas parish in Struthers were I learned how Easter was determined every year. It is always the first Sunday following the first full moon after the Vernal Equinox (the beginning of Spring). It is a "movable feast" as compared with Christmas which is always celebrated on December Twenty-fifth in the Latin

Rite of the Catholic Church. Monsignor taught us that the exact number of days during Lent are not what mattered—it is the WHOLE season that makes a difference.

According to his manner of thought, if we children decided that we could "cheat" on the Sundays of Lent and stop our Lenten practices that we had chosen to offer up to the Lord for ourselves or others, then we were not following the example of Jesus, Who fasted and prayed for forty days before beginning His public life of service and healing. Monsignor told us, "If you cannot walk with Jesus for forty days, children; you will never be able to walk with Him for your whole life!"

It is a lesson I have never forgotten. It is actually a reason why, even though Church Law allowed me to stop fasting when I turned Fifty-Nine, I have not done so; and, God willing, I will not do so for the rest of my years. Monsignor's teaching of how to "walk with Jesus" so impressed my thirteen year old mind that it has become a mantra for life. So, for me, there are no "cheat days" during Lent. I enjoy the challenge of trying to do something (or step aside from something) for however long the weeks last. In that way, the Feast of Easter is even more a joy. May your own Lenten journey be blessed, each and every single day.

DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

No me gusta poner objeciones a la semántica ni a las interpretaciones precisas y estrictas de los principios básicos de la vida. Esa resolución se aplica particularmente a la Sagrada Temporada de Cuaresma; especialmente con respecto a si uno puede o no "engañar" los domingos de Cuaresma porque, técnicamente, "no cuentan"!

Nunca olvidaré a Monseñor Dierker en St. Nicholas en Struthers, Ohio; un suburbio de Youngstown. Él fue el tercer pastor bajo el cual fui criado siendo niño (¡los tres eran monseñores!). Cuando Monseñor visitó las aulas de la escuela, lo que sucedía cada mes, a menudo hablaba de recordar vivir "de acuerdo con el espíritu en lugar de la letra de la ley". Con eso quería decir que si tratábamos de encontrar la manera de moverse un principio particular, ¡no intentábamos entender la razón por la que existía en primer lugar! Explicó además que si tomamos los domingos de Cuaresma como "días libres" (porque se los considera "pequeñas celebraciones" de la Resurrección) ¡estábamos tratando de encontrar un camino furtivo hacia el cielo!

Fue en el octavo grado en la parroquia de San Nicolás en Struthers donde aprendí cómo se determinaba la Pascua cada año. Siempre es el primer domingo después de la primera luna llena después del equinoccio de primavera (el comienzo de la primavera). Es una "fiesta móvil" en comparación con la Navidad, que siempre se celebra el 25 de diciembre en el rito latino de la Iglesia Católica. Monseñor nos enseñó que la cantidad exacta de días durante la Cuaresma no es lo que importa: es la temporada ENTERA lo que hace la diferencia.

Según su manera de pensar, si nosotros los niños decidimos que podíamos "engañar" los domingos de Cuaresma y detener nuestras prácticas de Cuaresma que habíamos decidido ofrecer al Señor para nosotros mismos o para otros, entonces no estábamos siguiendo el ejemplo de Jesús, que ayunó y oró durante cuarenta días antes de comenzar su vida pública de servicio y curación. Monseñor nos dijo: "Si no puedes caminar con Jesús durante cuarenta días, hijos; ¡nunca podrás caminar con Él toda tu vida! "

Es una lección que nunca he olvidado. En realidad, es una razón por la cual, aunque la Ley de la Iglesia me permitió dejar de ayunar cuando cumplí la Cincuenta y Nueve, no lo hice; y, si Dios quiere, no lo haré por el resto de mis años. La enseñanza de Monseñor de cómo "caminar con Jesús" impresionó tanto a mi mente de trece años que se ha convertido en un mantra de por vida. Entonces, para mí, no hay "días de trampas" durante la Cuaresma. Disfruto el desafío de intentar hacer algo (o dejar de lado algo) por el tiempo que pasen las semanas. De esa manera, la Fiesta de Pascua es aún más una alegría. Que tu propio viaje cuaresmal sea bendecido todos los días.
